

## Year 7 Knowledge Organiser – From Deserts to Garden

From Desert to Garden fits in with the liturgical theme of Easter/ Lent. During this unit you will develop an understanding of the Eucharist. This unit builds upon the idea of covenant from Unit 1 and how Jesus creates a new covenant.



## Holy Week

### Palm Sunday

On Palm Sunday, Jesus arrived in Jerusalem. The people were happy to see him and waved palm leaves. They made a path of palm leaves for Jesus to walk on.

### Maundy Thursday

On Maundy Thursday, Jesus had a special dinner with his disciples. This meal is called the Last Supper.

### Good Friday

On Good Friday, Jesus was made to carry a wooden cross through the streets of Jerusalem. He was also made to wear a crown made of thorns. He was left to die on the cross.

### Holy Saturday

On Holy Saturday, Jesus' body was put into a tomb. A large, heavy stone was put in front of the entrance. A Roman guard watched over it.

### Easter Sunday

On Easter Sunday, Jesus' friends visited the tomb and it was empty. Jesus had resurrected from the dead. For forty days they saw him in different places. Jesus then ascended to Heaven.

### Definition

CAFOD	Catholic Aid for Overseas Development
Covenant	An agreement between two or more parties.
Easter Sunday	Marks the resurrection of Jesus.
Good Friday	The day Jesus was crucified.
Gospel	An account of the life of Jesus Christ, meaning 'good news'.
Holy Week	The events surrounding Jesus' death and resurrection took place during the last week of his life in Jerusalem.
Lent	The six-week period before Easter observed by many Christians. It commemorates the 40 days during which Jesus fasted and resisted temptation.
Passover	A Jewish holiday that honours the freedom and exodus of the Israelites
Prayer	How Christians communicate with God, through both talking and listening.
Reconciliation	The sacrament of reconciliation is a sacrament of healing. The word reconciliation means 'to be at peace again'.
Resurrection	The belief that Jesus came back to life three days after he died on the cross.
Sacrament	Blessings that are received during an important ceremony, and they are sometimes referred to as 'rites of passage'.
Synoptic Gospels	The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke in the New Testament, which present similar narratives of the life and death of Jesus Christ.
Temptation	To tempt someone is to entice them or convince them to do something.
The Hail Mary	A Roman Catholic prayer to the Virgin Mary that consists of salutations and a plea for her intercession.
The Lord's Prayer	These are the words Jesus used when he taught his disciples to pray.

### How is Holy Week Celebrated?

- The central observance of Holy Thursday is the ritual reenactment of the Last Supper at Mass. The priest may wash the congregation's feet like Jesus did.
- **Good Friday - Roman Catholic** Christians hold a procession called the Stations of the Cross, which re-enacts Jesus' journey carrying his cross to his crucifixion. Catholics will not eat meat on Good Friday.
- Many Catholics worldwide celebrate Easter with special church services, music, candlelight, flowers and ringing of church bells. Catholics will hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' resurrection. They will also renew their baptismal promises.

The Shahada	The belief that there is no God but Allah and that Muhammad (PBUH) is his messenger.
Salah	Praying five times a day.
Zakat	Making an annual charitable donation to help the poor.
Sawm	Fasting during the month of Ramadan.
Hajj	Attending the pilgrimage to Mecca once in your lifetime.
