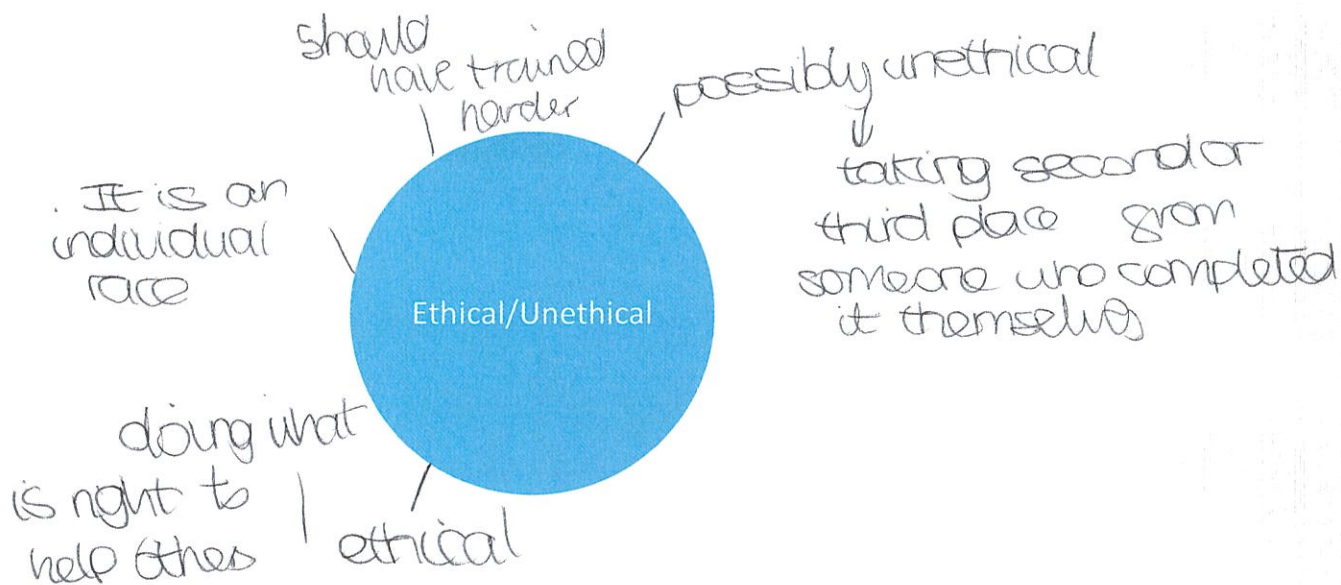
- ✓ Ethics are a very important part of sport.

Etiquette

An unwritten agreement between opponents to follow and abide by the written and unwritten rules.

disqualified when player grabs onto leg in swimming race

Sportsmanship

Attempting to gain an advantage by stretching the rules to their limit.

cheating in a clever way - time wasting

Gamesmanship

A convention or unwritten rule in an activity. It is not an enforceable rule but it is usually observed.

shaking hands after game, standing for national anthem

Contract to compete

Conforming to the rules, spirit and etiquette of the sport.

shaking opponents hand after a match or helping

injured player over finish line
