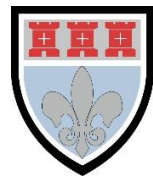

Tips for Making the Most of University Open Days

Plan Ahead: Register for Open Days in advance, as some universities require booking. Check the university's website for schedules and plan your day accordingly.

Prepare Questions: Think about what you want to know regarding courses, accommodation, student support, and extracurricular activities. Prepare a list of questions to ask staff and current students.

Explore the Campus: Take the opportunity to tour the campus, visit lecture halls, libraries, and accommodation facilities to get a feel for the environment.

Attend Subject Talks: Participate in course-specific presentations to understand the curriculum, teaching methods, and assessment styles.

Take Notes: Document your impressions and the information gathered during the visit. This will be helpful when comparing universities later.

Reflect Post-Visit: After attending, reflect on your experience. Consider how each university aligns with your academic goals and personal preferences.
