
check the apps your child is accessing and their recommended age

We know that this has been a difficult year for everyone and we really appreciate the way that you all continue to support our school values- resilience, responsibility, respect and engagement.

### **Home Reading**

Reading is the key to learning and is also a vital tool for children's wellbeing and enjoyment. Sharing stories together at home is a great way to encourage your child to love reading.

Children will bring home a library book each week to help you do this. This library book is to learn about the world, enjoy a poem or story and really get lost in a book together. You can read this to your child and ask them questions or challenge them to read some elements of it themselves.

Your child's reading book is directly linked to their reading age or level. These books should be easily decodable for children as it will match directly with their reading learning in school. If your child is still on our RWI phonics programme, this will be a book bag book. We advise that children read this 2 or 3 times so that they are absolutely fluent (smooth and speedy). For older children, off the RWI scheme, they will work through colour bands and eventually onto free readers. It is still important to hear children reading out loud at this level so that we can support them with any small misconceptions and their wider reading skills such as comprehension and retrieval. Please record in your child's reading journal every time you read with them. This can be a comment from you or them, a signature, a smiley face- anything! This really helps children see the joy and importance of reading as well as helping us to know that we are working together to get all of our Valley View children reading. Remember that two entries a week will get your child's name in a prize draw to win a £20 amazon voucher!
