Dear Parents,

This year we are in the top three most improved schools in Birmingham.

Some of you have contacted me with your concerns about the school tables which were created and published by the Birmingham Mail which placed Cardinal Wiseman at the bottom of the schools in the city. I looked at their data and some of it is from 2010 and the newest is based on 2012 GCSE results. None of our recent improvements are reflected in their information. This year OFTSED described our behaviour as 'GOOD' and said,

"Students work well together in lessons. They understand that others may have views different from their own and show a high degree of respect when this occurs."

"Students behave in a responsible manner around the school, so that breaks and lunchtimes are calm and orderly. Students are polite, courteous and friendly."

"Students show respect for each other and their teachers, and enjoy school life".

That view is based on reality. OFSTED were here for 3 days over the summer term and they saw our pupils, your children, in classes learning, they ate with them in the dining room, they stood out on the playground. We are a raidly improving school. **This year we are in the top three most improved schools in Birmingham.** That is a fact.

I am so disappointed for our children that their school has been presented in a negative light - they know that they come to a great school that is getting better every day. I am grateful for the words of support I have received from so many of you and assure you I will never give up on Cardinal Wiseman until we are the best school in this city!
