Monitoring of Cardinal Wiseman

Her Majesty's Inspector, Brian Cartwright (National Lead, Science) visited Cardinal Wiseman in November. During his visit he focused on both the Science Department and the Governing Body. Below are a few of the points that I would like to share with you that he made in his concluding letter:

Governing body meeting

This covered the planned agenda thoroughly, for the most part, and benefitted from knowledgeable clerking. The accompanying paperwork was comprehensive, allowing governors to prepare sufficiently in advance.

I note the substantial work already in place for teacher professional development that has good short-term objectives linked to improving teaching quality, and clear separation between training and performance management.

Work in science

In science I was impressed by the growing volume, and quality, of pupils' extended written responses to questions and research tasks, that indicate successful development of wider whole-school literacy policy. Science work was consistently marked well, with good developmental advice to pupils that led, in many cases, to good responses by pupils. In every class, the polite demeanour of pupils and their willingness to engage in learning made a strong contribution to their progress. Teachers should trust their own good 'lesson awareness' sense and allow pupils to complete tasks, make sure concrete examples of the science being taught are physically to hand, and ensure plenty of opportunity for pupils to develop practical skills.

Once again it has been re-assuring to read such good news. As a school, we are very much aware about what we need to do to improve and we will continue to develop and improve ourselves to enable us all to provide the best possible education for our pupils.
