Dear Parents/Carers,

Last week, I had a conversation with one of our wonderful year 8 students. Kaytlyn Parkhill told me about a disease which affects her life. Cystic Fibrosis, or CF, is a life-shortening inherited disease, affecting over 10,000 people in the UK. You can't catch or develop cystic fibrosis, it's something you're born with and most cases in the UK are now diagnosed soon after birth.

This week, Kaytlyn spoke to some year groups during their assembly about the disease, how people get it and how it affects their lives and the lives of their families. She also spoke about how it affects her own life.

It must take a lot of courage for a young person to cope and deal with living with CF and to be able to stand up in front of a year group in assembly and talk about something so personal is astonishing.

#### TACKLING ROBBERY OFFENCES ACROSS BIRMINGHAM



#### Be Aware

There have recently been a small number of robberies in this area. Don't make yourself an easy target.

#### Be Advised

- ✓ Electronic items such as mobile phones and mp3 players are regular targets for street robbers. Keep valuable items out of sight whenever possible.
- ✓ Try and stick to well-lit areas when walking alone and always remain aware of your surroundings. If you don't feel safe, stride purposely to deter robbers and quickly move away from the area.
- ✓ If your mobile phone is stolen, call your network immediately or ring 08701 123 123 to get it blocked.
- ✓ Make a note of the IMEI number of your phone. You can find this printed under the battery of most modern devices. Consider using tracker software/apps.
- ✓ Never wear gold chains or necklaces over the top of clothing. Thieves can snatch this from around your neck and make a quick getaway.
- ✓ If you are out with friends, always walk home in groups. The last person should call a taxi to ensure they also get home safety.
- ✓ Carry any bags securely. Put the strap across your body and make sure any fasteners or zips are closed and facing in towards your body.
- ✓ If you use a cash point, try to do so during daylight hours. Wherever possible, use cash machines inside banks or building societies. If you have to use a cash point at night, go with a friend and stay alert at all times.
- ✓ If you are listening to music through headphones, please ensure that any wires run discreetly under your clothing.
- ✓ Register your electronic items for free online at www.immobilise.com. This can help officers return stolen property to its rightful owner.

#### Be Reassured

We have increased patrols around this area and will be actively targeting thieves using a number of police tactics. Birmingham is one of the safest cities in the UK. By following this advice, you can further decrease the chances of becoming a victim of robbery.
