#### Knife Surrender Campaign

As you may be aware, Birmingham's latest push to drive down knife crime was launched earlier this month with a knife surrender campaign.

The surrender was called for by local people including young people who attended the Police and Crime Commissioner's Youth Summit in Birmingham in December last year and pledged their support for the surrender.

Members of the community and officers have been working with the London based Christian charity Word 4 Weapons to organise the placement of the bins.

A total of three knife disposal bins have now been installed across the city and there are plans for more in the near future. The first three can be found at:

- · New Testament Church Of God, New Spring Street, Hockley
- · New Testament Church Of God, 240-244 Lozells Road, Lozells
- · New Testament Church of God, Goosemore Lane, Erdington

A knife surrender differs from a knife amnesty in that there is no temporary suspension of laws against carrying a life while the surrender is in place and there is no fixed duration for the initiative.

We are not encouraging people to carry weapons on the streets to place weapons in the surrender bins. The most effective way to get rid of a knife remains disposing of it in a bin at home. The knife surrender bins will

simply provide an additional place for knives to be disposed of safely.

Anyone with information on those carrying a knife should call police on 101. People who do not want to speak to officers directly can call the independent charity Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.


