### **Brand New Library**

As you know, we take reading very seriously at Cardinal Wiseman. In January we started the DEAR (Drop Everything and Read) programme to improve our students reading skills which was praised in our most recent inspection. On Tuesday we opened our brand new library. The feedback from staff and students has been overwhelmingly positive with students impressed and wowed by the quality of the library.



Students from the School Council played their part in the initial design of the library asking for soft seating and a variety of warm colour which is provided by the lighting wells in the ceiling which can change to any colour. The students also asked for it to look modern and funky. I am sure that you will agree that we have listened to our students in providing a modern, spacious and inviting library. Even though the new library is much more open and spacious, it has been designed so that students have numerous discreet zones either side of the central shelving units where they can study and focus on reading. The library is a silent area for reading which students can access throughout and beyond the school day. It is open every day from 8.00am and after school until 4pm. It includes a special glassed-off study area which is for the use of year 11 students only for independent study.



We are currently in the process of purchasing more books to further enhance the DEAR programme. As stated in Edition 17 of the Friday letter, parents and carers have an important role to play in monitoring and encouraging the reading that their child does. I encourage you to get your child to read at home on a regular basis.

I would like to thank Miss McNamara for organising the books with the support from so many of our wonderful students who she has mentioned in the 'Star of the Week' section of this letter. This is a wonderful new facility at Cardinal Wiseman and we look forward to seeing our pupils using it on a regular basis to improve their education.
