Information from the police

We have been informed that there will be a high police presence at Circle Park off Kingstanding circle. This is due to the high amount of anti-social behaviour, both after school, evenings and weekends, including fires being started. They made it very clear that it's students from all over the area and all local schools. Please encourage your children to stay away from this area in the coming weeks – you at home and we at school want to keep our children safe and trouble free but this is obviously a trouble 'hotspot' that the police will be watching.

Dangerous Games – Peanuts and Tieday Friday

There are two games which students have been playing in school which are dangerous. They must stop playing these games immediately.

The first game is called *Tieday Friday*' where students pull each other's ties so hard that it can very difficult to undo the knot. This is exceptionally dangerous and some staff have reported to me that pupils are asking them to undo the knots for them which is unacceptable.

The second game is called '*peanuts*' where children join their hands together with the aim of physically bending the other persons fingers and hands back to make them surrender. One of our pupils has recently been to hospital and has sustained a fracture due to playing this game.



Safeguarding Alert - URGENT

All Pupil Watch Safeguarding patrol activity conducted jointly by Education Welfare Staff and West Midlands Police came to an end in July 2014. Under Section 16 of the 1998 Crime and Disorder Act, Police Officers still hold the powers to approach any person whom they believe to be of school age, to ascertain why they are not in school.

It appears that an individual may be using Pupil Watch as a cover for approaching children and or young people.

Please be aware of the following:

- **Pupil Watch patrols have now ceased.** If they are approached by any individual stating they work for Pupil Watch, they must not give any personal information. They should bring this approach to the attention of their parents, school staff and West Midlands Police.
- If any individual stating they work for Pupil Watch requests that the pupil leaves the location with them then **they must refuse to go** and should seek assistance as a matter of urgency from parents, staff and West Midlands Police.
- If any pupil is approached by a Police Officer, even if they are in full uniform then they are strongly advised to ask to see their warrant card and if in doubt seek assistance.
