Cardinal Wiseman Celebrates Success

Showtime 2015!

Showtime last year was a highly successful event providing the opportunity for our pupils to develop their confidence and performance skills. It was the first large scale production for many years and involved Dance, Drama and Musical performances from pupils in all years which were performed to family, friends and to all pupils in the whole school.

During assemblies on Friday last week all pupils were informed about this year's production (Showtime! 2015) and how it is going to be bigger and better than last year. First of all we are going to have two performance evenings. This will provide more opportunities for more pupils to take part in the show. Pupils from all year groups now have to start rehearsing their performances. Showtime 2015 is going to be combined with the Challenge Curriculum in years 7 and 8.

The Challenge Curriculum is where our pupils have opted to study an additional subject in smaller class sizes than normal in years 7 and 8. Pupils who study the Dance, Theatre Skills and Musical Performance will all be performing their work during the Showtime performance in the evening. Prior to Showtime, pupils who study the Creative Writing, Sport, French, Philosophy for Children, Environmental Studies will be exhibiting and presenting their class work to friends and family.

Therefore every child in years 7 and 8 will be either performing or presenting their work which will allow parents to see the fantastic work that their child has been doing at Cardinal Wiseman. We hope all parents will take up this fantastic opportunity.
