I would like to remind everyone that we are holding an Open Evening on Wednesday 24th June. This is primarily for pupils and parents of pupils in Year 5 to come and see our wonderful school and many pupils from years 8-10 will be asked by their teachers to be ambassadors at this important event. We have already invited all parents and carers of our current year 7 students to come and have a tour of the school with their child.

For Open Evenings in the past we have closed school early for pupils. Please note that on this occasion we will be having a normal school day.

Senior Leadership Residential – due to the fact that the school leadership team at Cardinal Wiseman will be involved in a major residential planning event, school will close at 12.30pm for pupils on Friday 26th June.

Induction Evening – Tuesday 30th June – 4-6pm. This is when parents and carers of pupils in Year 6 who are joining Cardinal Wiseman in September visit the school to listen to a presentation and fill in essential documents.
