We were in groups of 6; we worked as a group, playing games so that we could get to know each other and make friends.

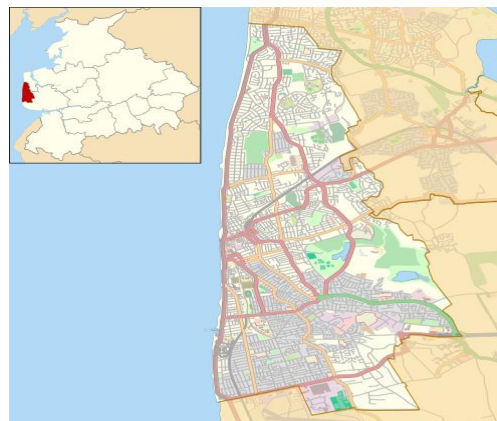
On the day there were eleven teaches and about ninety students.
