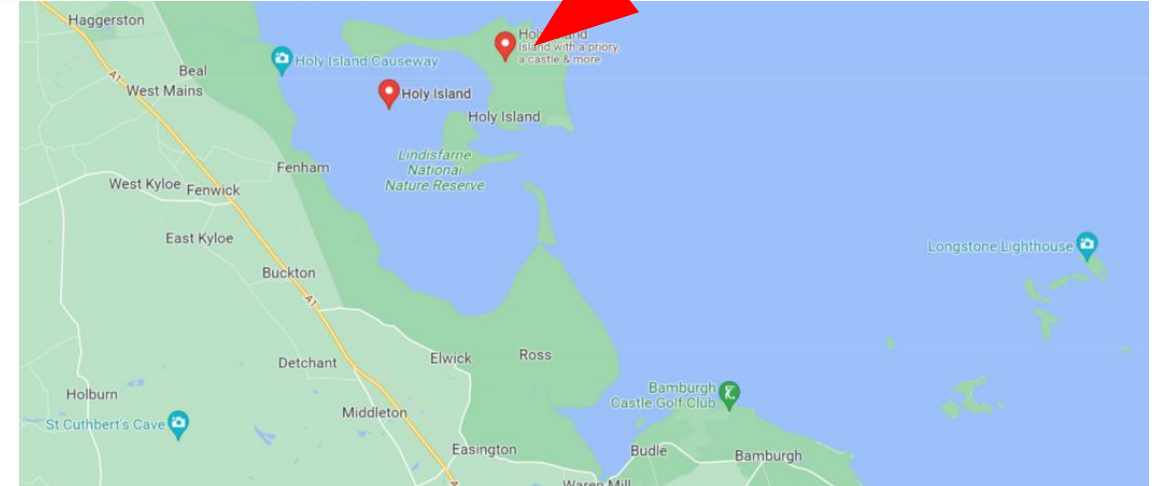
Lindisfarne

Lindisfarne, or Holy Island, is an island off the coast of Northumbria, England. It is known as one of the most important locations of early Christianity in England as it has a very important monastery, where lots of monks lived.

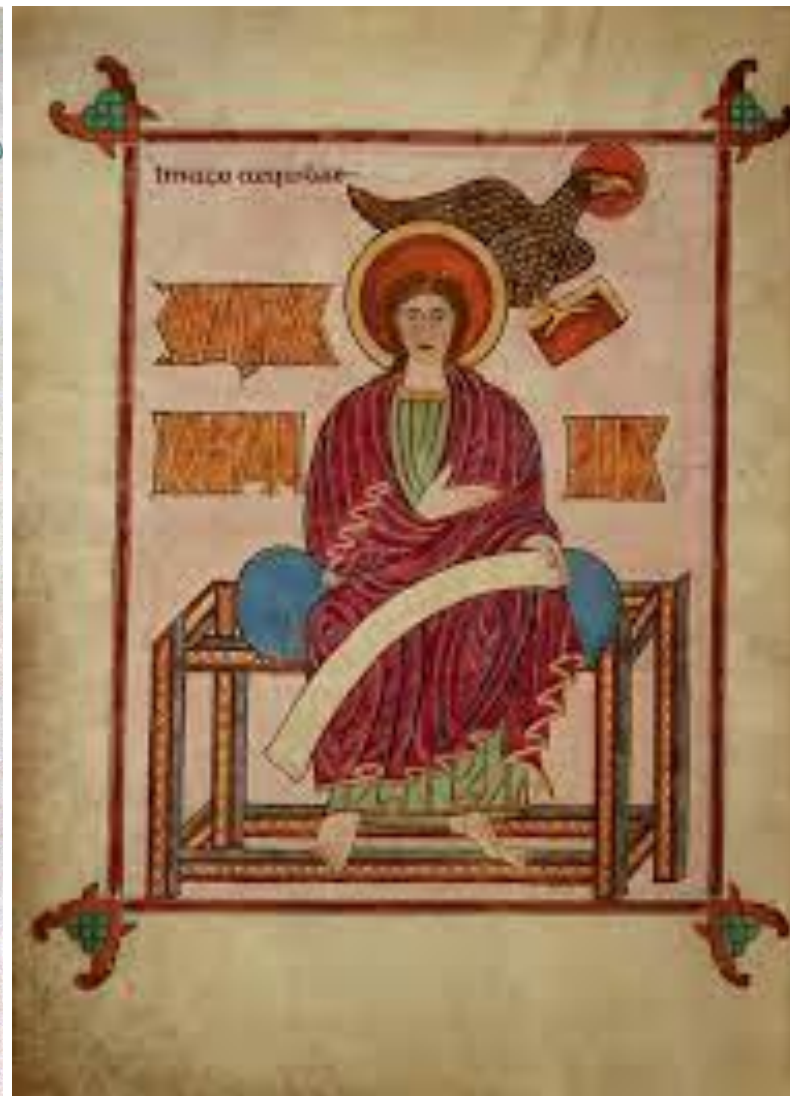
Lindisfarne Gospels:

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Viking Raid!

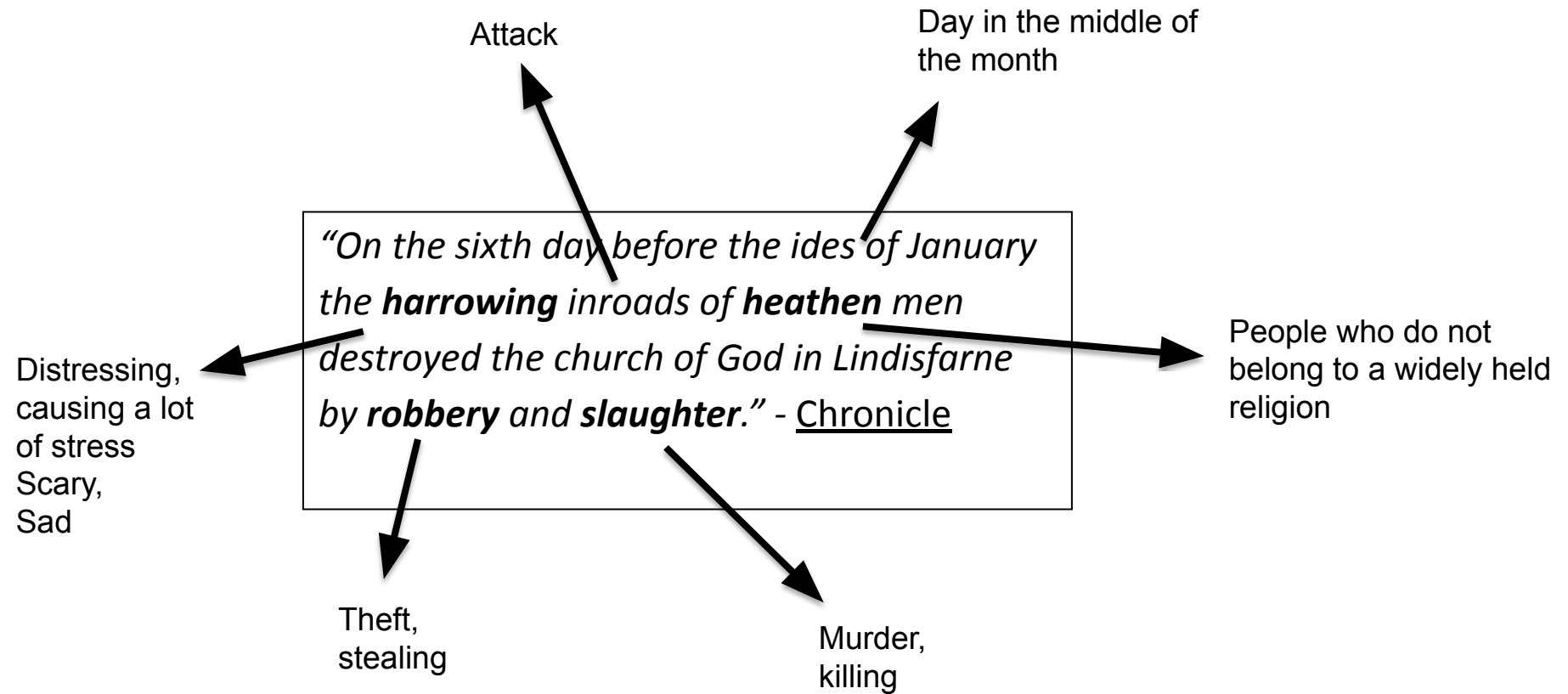
In 793AD, Lindisfarne was invaded by Viking men who did not believe in any God – they destroyed the church, stole from the monastery and killed a number of monks. Most of the village was destroyed and burnt down.

Some monks managed to run away and rescued Saint Cuthbert's remains, and a few books, including the Lindisfarne Gospels.

The story is told to us in an historical source called the Anglo-Saxon "Chronicle". This is one of the first books about English history, and was written in the 9th century.

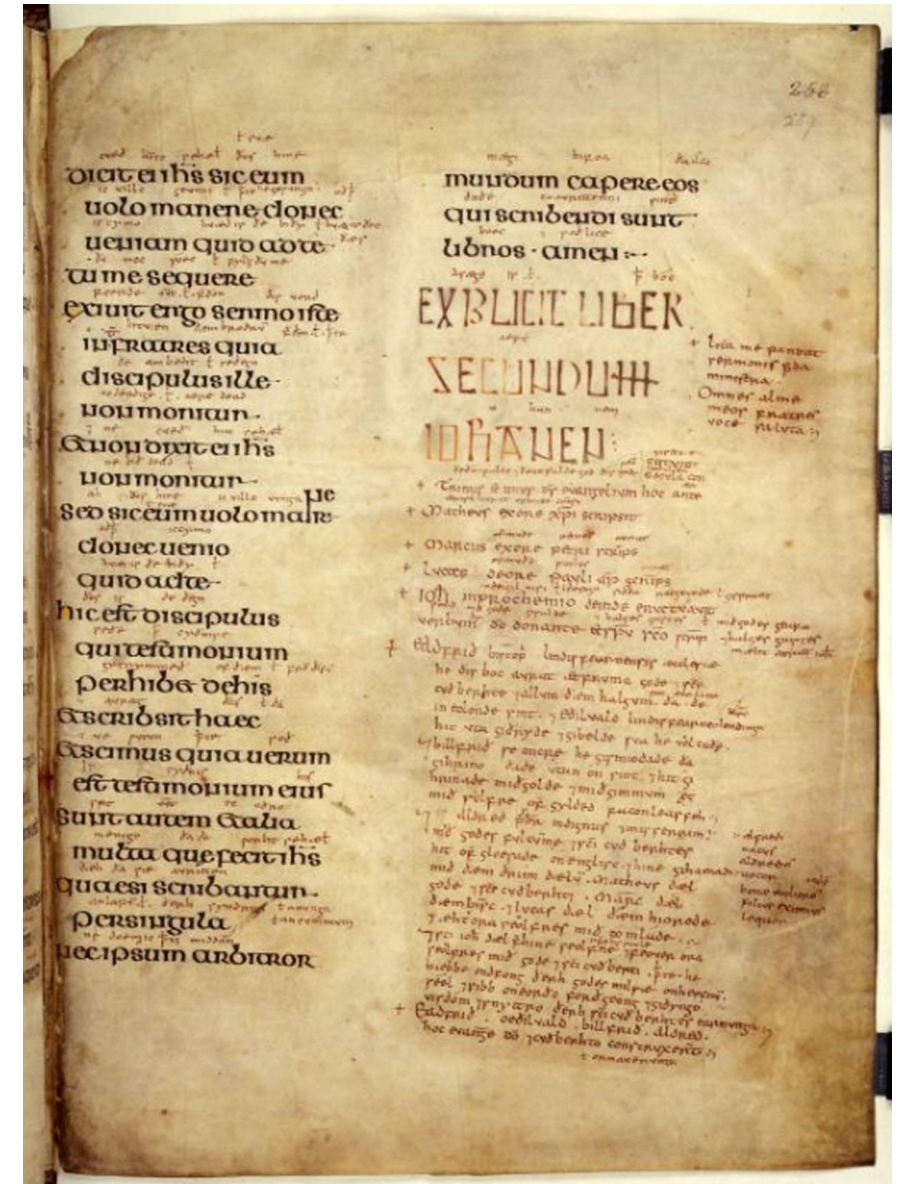

Lindisfarne Gospels updated

- Almost 300 years after their creation, the Gospels were updated by Aldred, in 970AD.
- He included a translation from Latin to English in the Gospels.
- This is the oldest English translation of the Gospels.
- English would have looked and sounded a lot different back then!



Lindisfarne Gospels updated

- In the Victorian Era, the Gospels were given a new cover. This was commissioned by the Bishop of Durham, Edward Maltby in 1852.
- It was a replica of what the cover would have looked like before the Viking raid.

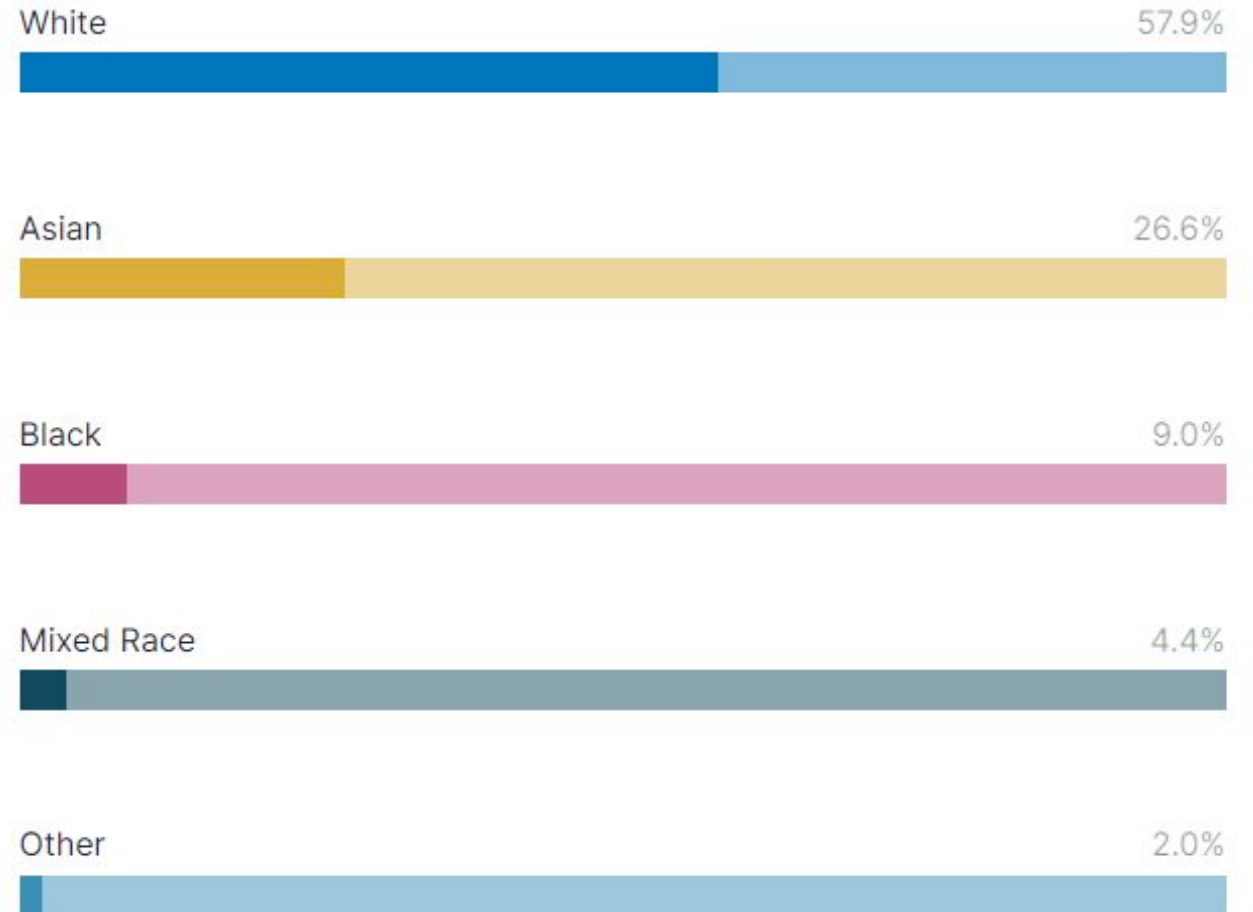


Ethnicities in Birmingham: White, Black, Mixed Race, Asian

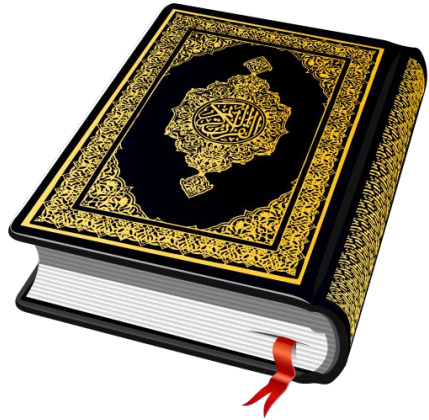
