Questions to think about:

What do you think it means by 'nature's offerings'?

What do you think the weather is like up here?

Do you think there are places like this in Britain? How long do you think this house has been standing here for? Why do the Smiths choose to live here do you think?

Sure, life out here on the island was very different. For a start, they didn't get their groceries from a supermarket, or visit the local pizza restaurant on a Friday night for a treat!

The weather up here could often be quite dramatic, even frightening. They frequently felt like the world was against them, yet they somehow found a way to harness nature's offerings.


It may be far from what most people would call 'civilisation', but it suited the Smiths just fine...


Reading


Please continue to access Lexia and Reading Plus at least three times a week to make the most of these reading programmes.

Computing

When you are done, save the picture.

PSHE

This week, I would like you to write a letter which can be read by your class teacher for next year. Think about what you would like them to know about you; what your interests and hobbies are; what you consider to be your strengths and weaknesses to be.

Remember, when we write/type a letter like this we can reflect on the last year and we can be honest. If you have found lockdown difficult, be truthful about it. If you have enjoyed lockdown – let us know! A reflection on this year would not be complete without some mention of lockdown and how we have coped with it.

Once you have written or typed your letter, please send them across to me. If you are moving up into Miss Noble's class next year (details of which are being sent out this week) I will make sure that she is given your email so she can get to know you a little better for September.

Topic

As this is the last week of this topic, I have come up with 3 activities that you can choose from. All three are linked to the topic in some way. You do not have to do all three. Choose the one that most takes your fancy.

Task 1

Choose a coastline of your choice (perhaps somewhere you have been or have always wanted to visit).

Research why people like to go there and why they don't like to go there, what attractions can be found, what features (human/physical) and what the climate is like. Can you create a climate graph for it? Try and draw a map of what the area looks like. If it is a coastline in England, can you find it on Digimaps and see how it has changed over the years?

Task 2

An important coastal ecosystem is coral reefs. We haven't had time to look at them, but can you find out about them? Where in the world are they found? Can you add them to a world map? What type of environment do coral reefs need to survive? How are they under threat and what is being done to save them? Choose a coral reef and research it in more detail. What interesting facts can you find that no one else knows.

Task 3

Plastic is a real issue for sea creatures. It threatens their habitats and when they eat it (having mistaken it for food), it can make them very sick. Research the efforts being made to remove plastic from the oceans and what more can be done to stop it making its way into the sea in the first place.

All tasks
