What is Read Write Inc Phonics?

A rapid Learn to read programme

so children can...

Read to learn for the rest of their lives

Why do we teach Reading?

- Reading opens the door to all learning.
- A child who reads a lot will become a good reader.
- A good reader will be able to read challenging material.
- A child who reads challenging material is a child who will learn.
- The more a child learns, the more a child wants to find out.

Who is it for?

- 4 year olds plus
- Older children who need to 'catch-up'
- Children new to English

Why does it work?

- The systematic and lively programme is organised by an in school manager.
- All staff (teachers and TA's) have received training.
- The children read and write for 50 minutes a day.
- They are placed in groups according to their reading level.
- Children do not struggle because the work is too difficult or get bored because the work is too easy.

How does it work?

The children:

- will learn to read and write 44 sounds and corresponding letters/letter groups using simple pictures
- learn to read words with a partner using sound blending
- read lively stories with a partner featuring words they have learned to sound out
- show their comprehension and compose stories based on picture strips

How can you help your child?

By...

- Saying the 44 English sounds in a pure way
- Knowing the letters and groups of letters (graphemes) used to read and write the sounds
- Understanding 'Fred' and how he helps with reading and spelling



Fred...

Fred helps children learn to read

Fred can only talk in sounds...

(Fred can only say c_a_t , he can't say **cat**)

We call this *Fred Talk*



Fred...

 If children understand Fred they can blend orally

Blending is needed for reading



Fred...

Fred helps children learn to spell as well!

Children convert words into sounds

They press the sounds they hear on to their fingers...

We call this *Fred Fingers*

Storybooks and Get Writing Books
















So how can you help your child?

By knowing the 44 pure sounds



- By knowing how to blend using Fred Talk for reading

- By knowing how to do Fred Fingers for spelling




- Attendance is vital
- Practice the sounds

- Listen to your child read daily
- Read as many stories as possible

By reading to your child lots of lovely stories and asking lots of questions!

Use these prompts to help you:



By talking to your child as much as possible and 'feeding' them new and different words:

"Let's eat our lunch now."
"Let's munch our lunch now."
"Let's scoff our lunch now."
"Let's devour our lunch now!"
