

## Spotlight on Careers

The weather is something we all take an interest in, so this we are highlighting careers in Meteorology.

**As a forecaster you will:**

- collect data from satellite images, radar, remote sensors and weather stations
- measure air pressure, wind, temperature and humidity
- predict the weather by analysing information and using computer programmes
- give weather information and reports to customers



**As a researcher you will:**

- study weather patterns and climate change
- improve computer predictions
- use research to predict floods
- study how the weather affects the spread of pollution or disease
