REVISION STRATEGY

Flashcards are definitely not new - many of our students use these regularly across their subjects! But students can double check whether they're being used in the most effective manner.

Flashcards should be short - one concept, date, idea or key person per card. They should be used both ways - test that you know what the key word means, but also check you know the key word from the definition.

The **making** of a flashcard isn't the most important part it's the revisiting and retrieval of key knowledge time and again. Once made, how often are students using them to self test? Is there time in the day for parents, carers, siblings or friends to support in testing students' knowledge?

CLASSROOM LEARNING: ELIZABETH AND RELIGION



This fortnight students have started revision of their final module - the British Depth Study. In class we are looking at the plans Elizabeth made to settle the question of religious conflict in England. We are also looking at the pushback and challenges she faced in this, from Catholic plots, to foreign intervention and even the challenge from her cousin, Mary Queen of Scots.
