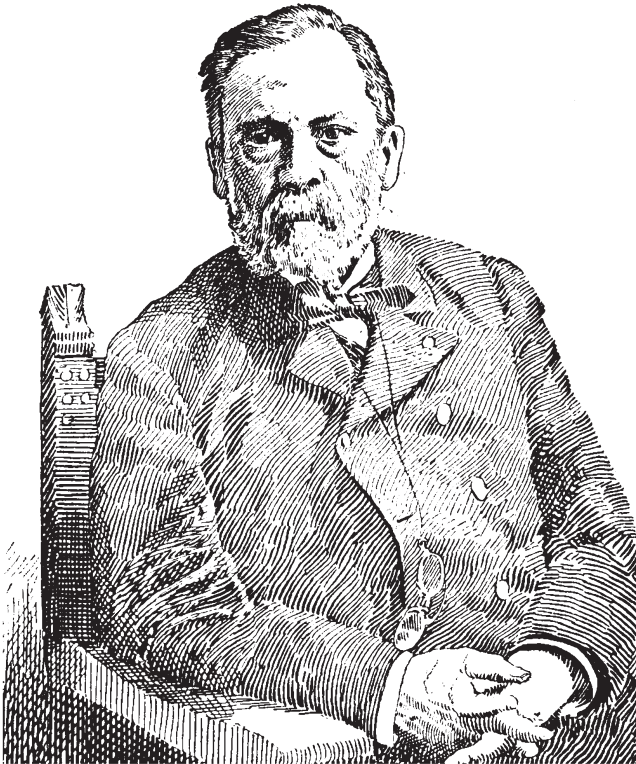

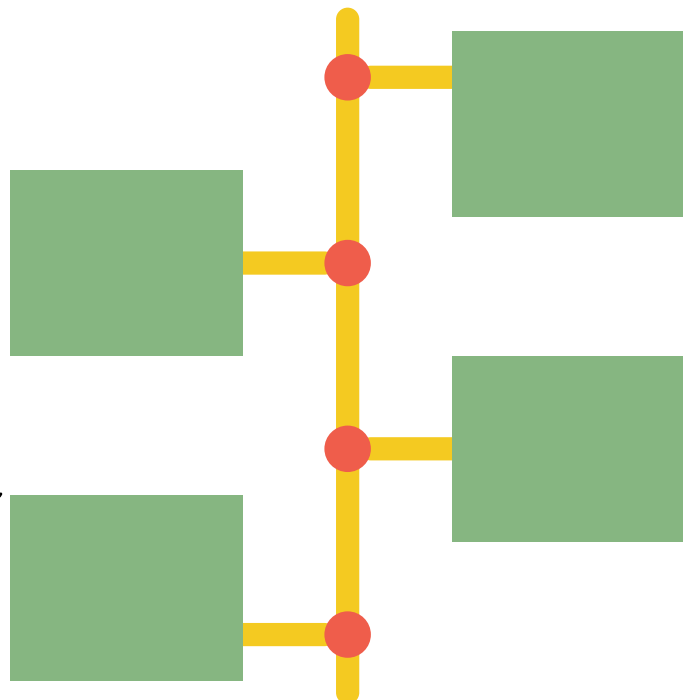

REVISION STRATEGY

As a subject rooted in chronology, one of our most effective revision strategies are TIME LINES.

Creating a timeline is, in itself, good revision. It forces you to think about the order of events (which links to causes and consequences) but also makes you select the key information for each event.

As parents and carers you can make the timeline a much more powerful revision tool! Allowing students to build their timeline in a shared space, like a hallway or staircase, can give them the space they need to cover large topics. It also means you can quiz them on information regularly, which is what makes the information really *stick*.



CLASSROOM LEARNING: INDUSTRIAL MEDICINE

Students this fortnight are working on a very important time period - 1700-1900, or the Industrial period.

Key people they need to know are

- Louis Pasteur (discovered germ theory)
- Robert Koch (who discovered ways of identifying particular germs)
- John Snow (discovered that cholera was spread through contaminated water)
- Edward Jenner (invented the first vaccine)
- Florence Nightingale (made nursing a profession in England)

Students will also revise their knowledge of public health improvements and the development of surgical techniques like anaesthetics.



Dinner Date **QUESTIONS**

- Who had the biggest impact on medicine - Louis Pasteur or Robert Koch?
- What did Nightingale do to improve hospitals?
- John Snow had changed very little about Cholera during his life. What stopped him?
- What arguments were made by anti-vaxxers in the 19th Century?



INTERVENTION DATES;
