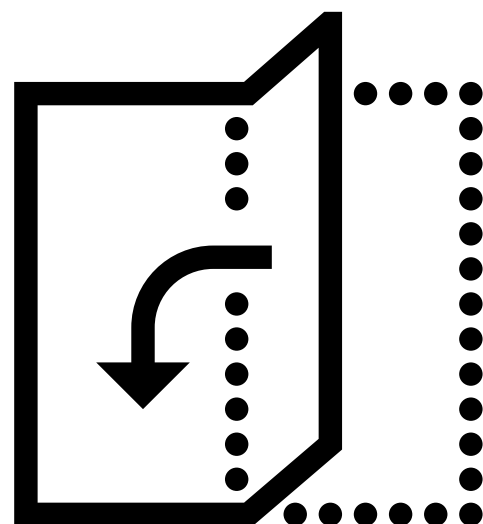

REVISION STRATEGY

Lots of students like to write notes for their revision - it's satisfying to have a binder full of writing, and it makes students think they have "covered" a topic. But research has shown that just writing out notes isn't effective revision.

The "Folding Frenzy" strategy can help students who like to write their notes to make their work more effective!

- Step 1: Write out a page of notes on a topic - we practice this week with the discovery of DNA.
- Step 2: Fold the paper in half. On the outside, write 5-10 revision questions on the notes inside. **Parents and carers can help by asking students to answer these later in the week.**
- Step 3: Fold the paper again and on the outside try to sum up the topic in images.



CLASSROOM LEARNING: INDUSTRIAL MEDICINE



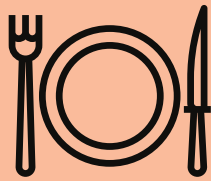
Most Year 11 students this fortnight are bringing their revision to a close. We are revising the modern medical miracles - penicillin, modern surgical treatments, and the NHS.
