Studley High School currently has 2 vacancies for Co-opted governors to join our LGC. Our focus is supporting school to maintain its outstanding status across quality teaching and learning, behaviour and personal development. High expectations around culture and community are key to this.

We welcome interest regardless of background but are particularly keen to invite applications from those with an educational background or who have previous board experience and also people who can occasionally visit the school during the day

Day and times of most meetings

Local Governance Committee meetings are generally Tuesdays 5pm-7pm

The time commitment

Approximately 10 days per year spent attending meetings, visiting the school from time-to-time and undertaking relevant training.

Why volunteer?

Volunteering as a School Governor is a great opportunity to gain leadership experience as well as transferable skills that enhance performance and employability. Most of all, you will have the satisfaction of making a real difference to children's lives and helping them to realise their potential.

This volunteer position is open to parents/carers or other people from our community. Co-opted governors are not elected by a parent election but are instead appointed directly by the Local Governance Committee.
