This operational guidance explains the actions of NCST schools to reduce the risk of transmission of Covid 19 in our school.

The actions have been identified and implemented in line with the document 'Schools Covid 19 Operational Guidance' <u>last updated - August 2021</u> by the UK Government. This government guidance is endorsed by Public Health England as part of Step 4 (the current phase of the government's response to the pandemic).

The following control measures have been identified by the government to create an environment where the risk of transmission is substantially reduced.

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19

Our actions are also in-line with the Newham 'Five Steps for Covid-19 Wellbeing'

Actions:

	Do the basics:	Nobody should enter the school site if they have Coronavirus symptoms.	
	Ensure good hygiene for everyone:	Students will be encouraged to sanitise their hands frequently throughout the school day.	
- Do the basics		Staff to wash hands regularly / when touching resources sanitise hands before and after.	
		Hand sanitising stations will be available at the school gates for students to sanitise their hands at the start of each day.	
		Hand sanitising units and handwashing facilities are located throughout the school and at key entry points to the building.	
		There are boxes of tissues in every classroom so that students can <i>'catch it, bin it, kill it'</i> .	
Stay safe	Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes:	The school has employed additional cleaning staff to clean frequently touched surfaces throughout the school day.	
Sta		Each classroom will be equipped with spray detergent so that furniture can be cleaned between classes.	
		Classroom doors will be held open at the start and end of lessons so that students do not need to touch door handles / touch points.	
		All classrooms will be thoroughly cleaned at the end of each day.	
	Keep occupied spaces well ventilated:	Classroom windows will be opened to ensure good air circulation and ventilation. Doors to the building will be kept open through the day.	
		Assemblies and staff briefings will take place in well-ventilated spaces with external ventilation.	
		All air conditioning units within the school have been serviced and filters changed. All units have been checked for COVID-19 compliance.	





Minimising external contacts All visitors will be asked at reception if they have coronavirus symptoms or have been in contact with anyone who has where possible: symptoms. If so, they will not be permitted onto the school site. Be kind - look after yourself and those around you Parental meetings will take place by telephone or online where possible. If face to face meetings must take place it will be in well-ventilated rooms and socially distanced. Minimising contact and mixing The <u>new school day</u> provides separate break-time and lunch-time for: years 7, 9, 11; years 8 and 10 so that fewer and maintaining social students are in social spaces at any time. distancing wherever possible: All students will be required to use separate gates to enter and leave the school site to limit numbers of students at single points: years 7, 8 and 9 will enter and exit the school via the Exning Road gate. Years 10 and 11 will enter and exit the school via the Chester Road gate **KEEP YOUR** DISTANCE Students will move around the school using the one way system. In classrooms students will sit side by side and facing the front, where possible - not in specialist classrooms e.g. Technology. Students will sit according to their seating plan. Use of face coverings: Students are no longer required to wear face masks in classrooms or in communal areas, they may wear them if they wish. If there is a local outbreak of Covid-19 we may expect students to wear a face mask in classrooms and communal areas. Staff and students should wear a face mask if they are travelling by public transport to school. Where <u>necessary</u>, wear Personal First Aiders and staff who work closely with those students who require close supervision will use PPE when appropriate. **Protective Equipment (PPE) (i.e.** First Aiders)

Get tested - know your Covid-19 status	Routine Testing in the community (asymptomatic cases):	All students will be offered the opportunity to complete two Lateral Flow Tests in school 3 to 5 days apart in the first two weeks of term from September 2nd. Students will then be provided with home testing kits to test twice weekly.
Get tested - know	Routine Testing:	 All staff and students undertake routine testing at home using a 'Lateral Flow Antigen' tests on a twice weekly basis - until the end of September If an individual tests positive for Covid-19 they should: Notify the school Request a PCR test within two days: PCR tests can be booked online through the <u>NHS Test & Trace website</u> or by calling 119. Remain at home whilst waiting for the PCR results
Stay home - if you have symptoms or test positive	Engage with NHS Test and Trace process	If a student or member of staff tests positive for Covid DO NOT attend school if you have been told by Track and Trace to self isolate, you must self isolate for the period that they give. NHS Test and Trace will make contact with individuals to identify close contacts. NHS Test and Trace will make contact with the close contacts and advise them to self-isolate. (Being in the same educational setting will not necessarily mean a person is identified as a close contact).
	Household members test positive for Covid-19	If a member of the household for either a student or member of staff tests positive, please notify the school.
Get vaccinated Protect yourself and others	Vaccination	All eligible people are advised by the government to take up the opportunity to be vaccinated against Covid-19. 	Individuals who are identified as Clinically Extremely Vulnerable	At present individuals identified as CEV are not required to self-isolate. CEV students should attend school as normal (unless medically advised not to) but may be supported with additional measures where necessary.





(CEV).	We will always follow the government shielding guidance and advice with regard to students (and staff) who are identified as 'Clinically Vulnerable' and 'Clinically Extremely Vulnerable. Those expected to shield will be provided with opportunities to work/ learn from home.
Contain any outbreak by following local health protectio team advice	Parents must inform the attendance team if a student or a member of their household has a confirmed case of COVID-19. The school is closely monitoring Covid cases and regularly seeks public health advice when necessary.
