

Religious Education Curriculum Key Stage 4

Vision

At Eastlea Community School Religious Education seeks to challenge all students to explore different beliefs and to discuss the key global issues that confront humanity in the 21st Century. Religious Education at Eastlea seeks to be experiential, creative and reflective. The curriculum is designed to ensure that pupils grow to be well-informed, upright and responsible citizens. It is sequenced with a particular rationale that consistently focuses on both knowledge and skills. Students are encouraged to constantly reason, debate, make judgements and evaluate key concepts and themes. The curriculum provides pupils with the development of social, spiritual, moral, and cultural development; these include learning about different people's faiths, reflecting on their own beliefs, investigating moral and ethical issues, understanding cultural influences and showing respect for different faiths and cultural diversity.

Teaching and Learning - AQA Route A - GCSE Specification

There are two main sections in the AQA GCSE RE (9-1) which are assessed through 2 exam papers at the end of Year 11. The content of each paper is split into different units and is as follows:

- Component 1: The study of two religions [Christianity and Islam]: Beliefs, Teachings and Practices: written examination **1 hour 45 minutes**, 50% of qualification
- Component 2: Thematic studies: written examination **1 hour 45 minutes**, 50% of qualification which assesses the following themes:
 1. **Theme A:** Relationships and families
 2. **Theme B:** Religion and Life
 3. **Theme D:** Peace and Conflict
 4. **Theme E:** Crime and Punishment
