
Vocabulary		
asexual reproduction	a process where one parent produces life.	
adolescence	the time when a child develops into an adult.	
embryo	A newly fertilised egg in the uterus.	
fertilisation	A process where a male and female sex cell fuse togther to produce a ferilised agg.	
foetus	an unborn offspring, from the embryo stage (the end of the eighth week after fertilisation, when the major structures have formed)	
Gestation	The length of time a mammal spends in its mother's uterus	
Life cycle	The process of a living thing from birth to death.	
Life expectancy	The length of time something lives for.	
Menstruation (period)	When a female discharges the lining of the uterus. This happens normally once per month.	
offspring	A mammal's young or children	
puberty	The time during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction	
reproduction	The production of offspring by a sexual or asexual process.	
sexual reproduction	A process where a male and a female sex cell are required to reproduce.	
species	A group of living things	
toddler	A young child who is just beginning to walk.	
uterus	An organ in the lower body of a woman where the offspring gestate and develop.
