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Topic: Raga Year: 7

What should I already know?

- Melodies are created from a musical scale (a series of notes)
- Different countries and cultures have developed a range of instruments which give a distinctive sound to the music from that country
- Instruments belong to different 'families' according to the way their sound is produced
- How to work cooperatively with others
- Some musical vocabulary to describe and analyse what has been played (e.g. dynamics, tempo, structure, timbre, duration, texture, pitch)

What will I know by the end of the unit?

I will be able to:

- name some families of instruments and give examples of individual instruments in each group
- name some Indian instruments and say how they can be used in a raga
- understand that a Indian music is made up of a melody, drone and tala (rhythm)
- play an individual part in a group performance
- compose a piece of music using a rag and which creates a particular mood
- write an evaluation of the music performed using specific musical vocabulary

Vocabulary	
raga	a scale of notes or the name given to a piece using those notes: the scale used helps to create the mood of the music
drone	a sustained note or notes which provide a backing for the melody
melody	the tune
ostinato	a repeated pattern used to accompany a melody
sitar	an Indian string instrument with a long neck which has some 'sympathetic' strings for the drone and fretted strings used for the melody
harmonium	a small organ with a keyboard and hand operated bellows to push the air through reeds, creating the sound
tabla	a pair of Indian drums which provide the tala (rhythm)
