3: Human and Physical - study of human and physical features through detailed case studies and understanding how processes interact to influence and change places.

4: Environment and SustainabilityAnalysis of the 'people and environments' with a focus on the dynamic range of environments and the impacts of human activity.

This theme introduces pupils to KS3 geography and in particular encourages them to build on their existing knowledge of places and environments with a focus now on the impacts human and physical geography have on each other and the developmental and environmental consequences associated with them at different scales.
