Key information

'Sport for All Day' marks the culmination of the house sport calendar. All pupils will compete for their house in a number of different sports during the day. As usual, they have had the opportunity to select their events during their house assembly this term. The activities range from traditional athletics events and team sports to more diverse activities such as board games, bowls and OAA problem solving.

The 'Annual Fun Run' will take on a different format this year due to the large number of pupils we now have in school. Each year group will start and participate in the event at different locations around the course. The new 1km route will allow pupils to count their laps and convert them into KM's. Certificates will be awarded to any pupil able to complete 3, 5 or even 10km. We hope that as well as taking part on the day, pupils will also get as many sponsors as possible. Arrival and departure

Parents and carers should arrive between 1.30pm-1.45pm. Please note the KS2 pedestrian gate will be locked after this time slot. Please do not arrive too early as this will create congestion at the school gate. Parents and carers will need to depart the school site at 3:00pm when pupils return to class. Pupils will not be permitted to leave the school before 3:20pm

<u>Parking</u>

Our car park is usually very full during the school day so parking will be unavailable. Please try to walk to school if at all possible. We have 2 parking spaces on site for the disabled who have a blue badge, please contact the main office if you would like to reserve one. The main school gates will be closed for the protection and safety of our pupils, staff and visitors; please access the site via the KS2 pupil pedestrian gate.

On arrival

Upon entering the school site, please report to a member of the safeguarding team at the sign in desks. You will then receive your visitor's booklet and seating location. Please be aware that you will be required to present a form of identification. This could be a driver's licence, passport or bank card.

During the event

Various spectator seating is available, please see your map for the locations on the day. Take a seat in the viewing station and enjoy watching the race. Feel free to bring snacks and refreshments with you.

An Artisan Coffee van and an Ice Cream van will be on site during the afternoon if you prefer to purchase refreshments. Toilets and a suitable space for baby changing are available in the PE department.

Photography, mobile phones and social media

We look forward to seeing you next week, and ask that no photographs are taken of the event in line with our safeguarding policy. Photographs and media posts should not be shared on social media.

Please note video recordings of children are not permitted. Both events will be celebrated via the main school Twitter account and the specialist PE account.







Conduct

Please remember that we are a no smoking/vaping site and that the consumption of alcohol is not permitted at this event. As always, the safety of our pupils and staff is paramount; we have the right to ask any visitor to leave the school site if we feel they are being verbally abusive or using inappropriate language.

Pupil information

For the week to run smoothly, all pupils (including those who are currently injured) will need to come to school in their Edward Peake PE kit (navy blue or black jumper, black shorts, PE polo shirt, socks and trainers).

To make the 'Annual Fun Run' even more of an occasion, the pupils can choose to run in fancy dress rather than their PE kit; additional house points will be awarded for the best costumes! (Please remember that costumes must be appropriate and suitable for running outside!).

On the day of the fun run pupils will be able to come to school in their fancy-dress costume or non-uniform; if their costume has large accessories, these must be brought to school in a named bag. This year we are asking all pupils to return their sponsor forms and donations before the end of the Summer Term.

Preparing for the weather

Pupils will need a water bottle to keep hydrated throughout the day and sun cream and a hat to ensure they remain comfortable in the sunshine.

Fundraising

We hope the children will be encouraged to gain a number of sponsors from their family and friends. All monies collected should be handed into their form tutor - during morning registration - in a named and sealed envelope, by the end of the Summer Term.
