## **SUMMER TERM**

I hope you had all had a lovely Easter break. It is great to see the children have come back fresh and ready for their final term here at All Souls' — I cannot believe how fast this year has gone already! This term always proves to be a busy one, beginning with the SATs that children will be sitting in a few weeks and ending with our end of year production at Bablake.

## **CURRICULUM**

Below is an outline of what children can expect over the next few months.

**SATs Revision:** As you are all aware, Year 6 will be sitting their SATs the week commencing 9<sup>th</sup> May 2016. Please see the additional letter which was sent out earlier this week for more information. We are now at the stage of revising the areas we are weaker at as a class across both English and Maths. On a few days a week, the class split into groups to ensure we are targeting children's individual needs as much as possible. Children should be well aware of their weaker areas by now and are encouraged to visit recommended websites or go through old practice test papers to revise their areas of need.

<u>Writing:</u> We will be exploring a range of text types this term, enabling children to apply their knowledge of these and show off all their spelling, punctuation and grammar skills. Writing is a part of the curriculum that is teacher assessed and therefore children need to remain consistent with their writing across all subjects, including homework when set. We have already begun the term with writing a promotional leaflet encouraging people to visit our city of Coventry and an information text on a topic of their choice.

<u>Reading:</u> Reading is so important for numerous reasons. Not only does it improve children's imaginations, but it also helps them build their own vocabulary and improve their understanding when they listen. We do a variety of reading activities in school but I would also like to encourage children to read a book for pleasure at home. As always, reading records are due in on Mondays and should be signed by an adult to say that it is an accurate record of reading each week.

<u>RE</u>: Our topics to begin this term are Easter and Pentecost. We will also be continuing our Confirmation unit, in which children will be exploring a Saint of their choice whose name they will adopt when they receive the Sacrament of Confirmation later this term.

<u>Geography:</u> We will continue to explore rivers, looking more closely at rivers in Europe before moving on to some skills work relating to time zones and lines of latitude and longitude.

<u>History:</u> Our next topic is a study of the Stone Age to the Iron Age where we will find out what Britain was like throughout this era.

<u>Science:</u> This term we will be studying 'Animals including humans' and 'Living things and their habitats'. I will be aiming to get outside where possible through the second unit and will be setting some exciting projects for homework too.

<u>Music:</u> We will begin practising the songs for our play very soon... I am sure you will enjoy listening to them being rehearsed at home!

<u>PE:</u> We will be learning how to play cricket and taking part in numerous athletic activities – we are already enjoying being out in the glorious sunshine!

**SRE:** This term, we begin exploring SRE through which children will learn more about personal hygiene, the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up and relationships. Some of these topics will be more discrete whereas others may be linked in with our science topic. More information regarding this will be sent out shortly – you will also be invited to join in with certain parts of this.
