Beginning to be aware of the way stories are structured. Listens to and joins in with stories and poems, one-to-one and also in small groups Describes main story settings, events and principal characters. Suggest how the story might end. Recognises familiar words and signs such as own name and advertising logos.	Uses shapes appropriately for tasks. Shows an interest in numerals in the environment. Sometimes matches numerals and quantity correctly. Uses positional language Separates a group of three or four objects in different ways, beginning to recognise that the total is still the same.	Shows interest in different occupations and ways of life. Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world. Shows care and concern for living things and the environment. Talks about why things happen and how things work. Can talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects. Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time	Understands that tools and equipment have to be used safely. Walks down stairs, two feet to each step while carrying a small object. Draws lines and circles using gross motor movements. Can stand momentarily on one foot when shown. Holds pencil between thumb and two fingers, no longer using a whole hand grasp. Can copy some letters, eg. Letters from their name.

Imitates movement in response to music. Enjoys joining in with dancing and ring games. Uses available resources to create props to support role play Beginning to construct, stacking blocks vertically and horizontally, making enclosures and creating spaces. Build stories around toys. Understands that they can use lines to enclose a space, and then begin to use these shapes to represent objects.	Responds to simple instructions, e.g. to get or put away an object. Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall. Beginning to use more complex sentences to link thoughts eg using and, because. Can retell a simple event in correct order, eg. went down slide, hurt finger Shows understanding of prepositions such as 'under', 'on top', 'behind' by carrying out an action or selecting correct picture. Uses talk to connect ideas, explain what is happening and anticipating what is happening next.	Can play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas e.g. building up a role play activity with other children. Enjoys responsibility of carrying out small tasks Shows confidence when asking adults for help. Keeps play going by responding to what others are saying or doing. Can usually tolerate delay when needs are not immediately met, and understands that wishes may not always be met. Confident to talk to other children when playing and will communicate freely about own home and community.
