Explores and learns how sounds can be changed Explores and learns how colours can be changed Beginning to be interested in and describe the texture of things Joins construction pieces together to build and balance Realises tools can be used for a purpose Notices what adult do, imitating what is observed and then doing it spontaneously when the adult is not there Engages in imaginative role play based on own first hand experiences	Focussing attention – still listen or do, but can shift own attention Is able to follow directions (if not intently focused on own choice of activity) Questions why things happen and give explanations, asks e.g. who, what, when, how Uses intonation, rhythm and phrasing to make the meaning clear to others Builds up vocabulary which reflects the breadth of their experiences Uses talk in pretending that objects stand for something else in play, e.g. 'This box is my castle'	Is more outgoing towards unfamiliar people and more confident in new social situations
