The children have worked with Miss Quinn over the past few lessons to build up a piece of artwork, from painting to collaging the children have independently completed every part of their art piece and are now nearing completion.











In our art lessons this week, Year 4 have learnt about the Japanese artist Hokusai - we've made blended backgrounds, collage waves and tried out suminagashi (floating ink on water)!

Year 3 have been very busy this week. In Englsih, we have been editing our letters and publishing them in our best handwriting. In maths, we have been adding and subtracting different mass together. On Tuesday, we were able to go to celebrate Mass, with year 4.





This week we have welcomed Mrs O'Shea to Year 5. She has been teaching us how to write adventure stories and got us to think carefully about our sentences. We have particularly enjoyed including show not tell in our writing to describe our characters thoughts and feelings. We are looking forward to showing you some of our published pieces soon!

Also in Year 5 this week, we have been learning about martyrs. We started learning about this at Alton Castle where we were taught about St Jose Sanchez Del Rio. St Oscar Romero has been a focus for us in our RE lessons. We have looked at his life and explored how he lived out Jesus' teachings in the Parable of the Good Samaritan.





In our Art lessons, we have been creating dragon eyes, blending different colours to create a 3D effect I think you'll all agree Alicja's and Tessa's look very effective!

We have been debating whether it is easy to answer God's call in the modern day to support us in our understanding of vocation and using roleplay to demonstrate our belief in the Holy Trinity and how each part helps us to strengthen our relationship with God.


