#### Home/School Agreement

The school's home/school agreement outlines the core responsibilities of the school, parents and children as we work in partnership to achieve the best possible outcomes for all. Each year we ask all parties to renew this commitment by rereading and signing this agreement. Over the next week, teachers will be talking to children about this, sharing their commitment and our expectations of the children, and then signing two copies of the agreement with the children. These two copies will then be sent home for parents to also read and sign. We ask that one copy of the agreement is then returned to school to be kept in the classroom and the other copy remains at home as a reference. If you feel that you are unable to sign this agreement, please do discuss this with your child's class teacher.

# <u>Uniform</u>

It is great to see the children looking so smart as they return to school for a new school year. The uniform expectations can be found on the school <u>website</u>. Whilst we endeavour to ensure that our uniform requirements place the least financial burned on families as possible, we know that purchasing uniform items does cost, and therefore ask that parents do ensure that all uniform items are clearly labelled with children's names so that any 'lost' items can be

returned.

### <u>Attendance</u>

We worked hard in partnership last year to raise whole school attendance and reduce the number of children who are persistently absent and this is something which we must continue into this new academic year. Attendance will continue to be a high priority for all schools as the evidence is clear that it has a direct impact on children's attainment, progress and well-being. Attached to this week's newsletter is a copy of our attendance policy, which was approved by Governors this week. It outlines the school's approach to attendance in light of changing national and local guidance. Quite simply, it is an expectation that all children will be in school, arriving on time, every single day of the academic year unless they are too unwell to attend. Children can, and should, still attend school with minor ailments and school staff will always make contact with parents if they feel that children are too unwell to remain in school. All absences should now be reported to the school via StudyBugs and I encourage any parents who are yet to download this app to do so and register as soon as possible. We are currently at a 78% parental take-up and it would be great to get this up to 100%. If you require any support with this, please do get in touch with the admin team.

The school cannot authorise holidays during term time and can only authorise term time leave in exceptional circumstances. All such leave must be requested in advance, via the form located on the school website.

Please note that the school is obliged to challenge all absences and that, if a child accumulates 10 unauthorised absences (equivalent to 5 days, as there are two sessions per day) during a term we will apply to the local authority for a penalty notice to be issued.

We will continue to reward children who achieve 100% attendance each half term and will continue to report on attendance on a weekly basis within the newsletter.

### Please do not use the driveway


