Whole school attendance last week was just above 96% again. Punctuality has continued to be at improved levels from last academic year – particularly when you consider that, for this week last year, 38 late marks were recorded.

Please note that a number of automated messages have been configured in StudyBugs. These include messages to parents of any children with a late mark (Code L or U) each day. This is in response to a number of instances last year where parents were unaware that their child had been marked as late until mid or end of year reports were issued. Please be reminded that any child who is not present in the classroom when the register is taken at 8:45am will be marked as late. Any child who arrives after 9:00am is classed as 'late after the close of register' (marked officially as a code 'U') and, from an attendance perspective, loses their morning attendance mark. Code U's equate to an unauthorised absence.

Another alert that has been automated is one to parents of children who have not arrived at school and whose parents have not informed the school of this, via StudyBugs. If a child is absent for a series of days, relating to the same illness, please ensure that StudyBugs is used each day of absence to notify the school. This will prevent absences being either recorded as unknown or unauthroised, or a member of the admin team contacting you, which is their duty if we haven't heard from you.

Please note that Friday 27th October is a teacher training day. School will be closed on this day and reopens Monday 6th November 2023.
