

## End of an era



## Mobile phones and smart devices including Smart Watches

Please note that under current safeguarding guidelines and policy, children should not have with them, in school, any devices which are connected directly to the Internet or are capable of recording images, audio or video. This includes mobile phones and smart watches. The only exception to this is for pupils in Year 6 for whom consent has been granted for them to walk home unaccompanied, in which instance any devices brought in should be handed into office staff upon arrival at school, where they are stored securely, and then collected at the end of the school day.
