At 96.6%, Year 3s attendance for the year is the <u>highest class</u> total (followed by Year 5 with 96.5% and Year 4 with 96.3%). In contrast the attendance of our <u>Reception</u> class continues to cause concern with overall attendance for the year at 90.1% - which is significantly below the national average for Reception cohorts)




A special mention to Olive in Year 2 – the youngest runner in the cross country race who finished in an impressive 54th place!
