Key Information

<u>Alton Castle:</u> We will be heading to Alton Castle for our residential trip **Monday 17th March - Wednesday 19th March 2025.** Through a unique blend of outdoor adventurous activities and inspiring retreat experiences, Alton Castle promotes personal, social, and spiritual development, enabling children to encounter Christ through creation, challenging activities, and community.

This will be a fantastic opportunity for the class to experience independence whilst also having fun with their friends and making memories.

<u>Attendance and Punctuality</u>: It is very important that your child's attendance is as high as possible this term and that they arrive in school on time and ready to learn. There continues to be a strong correlation nationally between children's attendance and progress and so we ask that you support us in helping each child to achieve their potential.

<u>Homework:</u> In Year 5, children will receive homework every week and are expected to complete this on time and independently where possible. Weekly homework will be set on a Monday, due in the following Monday and will consist of the following:

Reading: Ideally, children should be reading daily; however, we understand that this may not always be possible and therefore we set an expectation for children to read at home for a minimum of 4 times per week. Children should bring their reading record and book into school daily but are asked to ensure an adult at home has signed it before they hand it in on Monday morning when they will then be checked and signed by a school adult and returned for the children to take home at the end of the day. If the reading record has not been handed in, not been signed by a parent/guardian or does not evidence that the child has read at least 4 times in a week at home, children will be given a chance to do so by the next day or attend reading club during their break time. In Year 5, this is ultimately the child's responsibility, but we kindly ask that you support them in this. We do not want reading to become a battle or a chore but for children to find pleasure in the world of books; if you would like any support with this, please ask.

<u>SPaG.com/TTRS/LBQ</u>: Each week, children will be set some form of grammar and maths homework, often set via these websites which they have been provided individual logins for. If there are any issues around access to a device or the internet, please do let us know as soon as possible so that alternative arrangements can be made.

Spellings: Every Monday, children will receive 5 words from the Year 5/6 statutory word list which they should practise each night alongside the spelling rule of the week from which they will be tested on 5 associated words the following Monday.

<u>Writing:</u> Each Wednesday the children will receive a written task in their Homework Book to write 3-5 sentences to demonstrate the learning from that week. This should be completed and handed in on a Monday in line with the due date for their maths and SpaG homework.

*Children may also be set other homework from time to time, either in relation to whole school projects or individual needs.

We are very proud of how hard the children worked last term and the progress that each child made. It has already been such a pleasure to help them along their journey and watch as they have matured and adapted to the new level of challenge that Year 5 brings! I look forward to speaking with you once again at our open evening after the half term break.
