Here comes the sun...

We hope you and your families had a lovely Easter break. The children have been busy sharing their holiday news in school. It's hard to believe we are beginning our final term. The children have settled back in beautifully and have been working hard and listening well. We have been so impressed with how well they have adapted to being dropped off at the gate this week.

In RE, we are learning about Easter and will soon be learning about Pentecost. Our final topic will be Prayer. In curriculum time, we will be looking at a traditional tale, finding out about how to look after our teeth, learning about a story from another culture (Handa's Surprise) and a story from the past (Flotsam). Later on in the term, we will be working with the children on transitioning into Year 1. We also have a final trip to look forward to (further details to follow soon!).

We will be continuing to work on ensuring that the children feel happy and are prepared for their move into Year 1. The children will be developing the confidence to make decisions for themselves and make their needs known. They will be able to take a more active role in their learning journey. Friendship groups that have been made will be grown and developed and we will be encouraging the children to solve small disagreements between themselves.	The children will continue to be encouraged to speak in sentences, sharing news and asking for help. As well as listening and responding to ideas expressed by others, the children will also be encouraged to answer 'how' and 'why' questions about what we experience and learn through our topics.	We will continue to practise our fine motor skills by cutting, sticking, rolling and stretching. We do this using Lego, play dough, threading, sand, marbles and building and model making materials. We will continue to use these fine motor skills to help form our letters more accurately.

Other areas

We will continue to build on our phonics and reading skills in our daily phonics lessons. We will be using our skills to improve our sentence writing and will work on our finger spaces and the use of capital letters and full stops.	We will be looking at addition and subtraction, grouping and sharing and manipulating shapes.	We will be looking at how things grow and will be doing some planting. We will learn a story from the past and will compare it to our world now. We will also be looking at a different culture.	We will continue to produce different artwork, exploring a variety of materials, tools and techniques. We are going to study a local artist too. In music sessions, we will listen to different types of music and explore how they make us feel.

Reading

Reading is a huge part of our EYFS curriculum in Reception and is our main homework focus. We are expecting the children to read at least 5 times at home. Please keep supporting your children with this. Thank you!

Warmer Weather

We can only hope that the warmer weather will stick around! As we spend quite a bit of time outside each day, please ensure your child has a sun hat in their bag and sun cream applied. Our outdoor area is a sun trap so this is essential.
