Welcome back! Happy New Year and welcome to the term ahead. This term we will be focussing on Speaking and listening, Floating and Sinking, Winter and our fine motor skills. We will be encouraging the children to become independent learners and to respect the equipment and the environment whilst doing so. During the second half of the term, we will explore Spring and New Life.



Below are some of the learning objectives and themes we aim to cover in each area of learning this term:

R.E

- Learning about our Class Saint - St Bernadette
- God who cares for us
- Lent
- Easter

Communication and language

- Focus to follow an instruction
- Use talk to organise themselves and their play: "Let's go on a bus... you sit there... I'll be the driver."
- Continue to use language to make our needs known
- Begin to learn phonics sounds

Personal, Social and Emotional development

- Begin to share and take turns with peers
- Become secure in their new environments and become independent learner
- Begin to be able to talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'. Begin to share and take turns
- **Physical Development**
- The children will continue to take part in PE lessons with Miss Jade. (Please have PE kits in on Tuesday)
- They will continue to practise fine motor skills using threading, playdoh, pencils and crayons and scissors and then start to transfer these skills to hold a pencil and use it effectively.

Literacy

- We will begin to learn the phonic sounds and continue to say our alphabet rhyme
- Listen to stories connected to our feelings, floating and sinking, and winter
- Recognise our names

Maths

- We will continue to follow our scheme of work learning how to recognise numerals, count and order numbers to 5
- Begin to count and recognise to 10
- Sort and match by shape and size, discover pattern and explore capacity

UTW/Expressive Art

- We will explore the weather and how it changes
- We will begin to understand how things grow in the natural world
- We will explore how to stay safe in the street
- We will experience visits out to learn about the world around us.
- **We will be exploring the seasons outdoors when the opportunity allows, so please can you ensure that your child has weather appropriate clothes and wellingtons.*

Above all of these things, we will continue to have FUN!

Thank you for your donations last term; we were able to replace toys and provide learning opportunities that would not have been possible without your generosity. The bear will continue to be outside daily this term and we will be grateful of your support.
