Sunday Gospel and Reflection

Gospel Reading for Sunday 14th June 2026 – Matthew 9:36-10:8 (11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A)

At that time: When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.'

And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every affliction. The names of the twelve Apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them, 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And proclaim as you go, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is at hand." Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without paying; give without pay.'

Short reflection:

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus looks at the crowds of people around Him and is filled with compassion. He can see that many are struggling, worried, and in need of help. The Gospel tells us that they were "like sheep without a shepherd." Jesus cares deeply about them and wants them to know God's love.

Jesus then gathers his twelve disciples and sends them out to help others. He gives them a mission: to bring hope, healing, peace, and the good news of God's kingdom.

This Gospel reminds us that Jesus calls ordinary people to do extraordinary things. The disciples were not famous or powerful, but they were willing to listen to Jesus and serve others. In the same way, Jesus calls each of us to make a difference in the world around us.

For children and families, this mission begins with simple acts of kindness. We can bring God's love to others by:

- helping someone who is struggling, including those who feel left out,
- speaking kindly,
- sharing what we have,
- praying for those in need.

Jesus reminds His disciples, "You received without charge, give without charge." Everything we have—our talents, our time, our love—is a gift from God. We are called to share these gifts generously with others.

Parents can help children recognise that they are already part of Jesus' mission whenever they choose to care for others and show compassion. The good news is that Jesus does not ask us to do everything. He simply asks us to be willing to help, one person and one act of kindness at a time.

It has been another busy and successful week for sport at All Souls!

On Monday, our girls' football team took part in the Catholic Schools Football Rally. They performed brilliantly in the group stages, securing a win and a draw to progress to the semi-finals. There, they faced Our Lady in a closely contested match and came out on top with a fantastic 1–0 victory. In the final, the girls met St Thomas More, a strong side they had previously faced in the group stage. Despite a determined effort and excellent teamwork, they were narrowly defeated 3–0, finishing in an impressive second place overall. Well done to the team for their hard work and resilience!

On Tuesday, eight Year 5 boys took part in a futsal festival. The event focused on participation and enjoyment rather than competition, and all the boys played brilliantly while having a fantastic time.

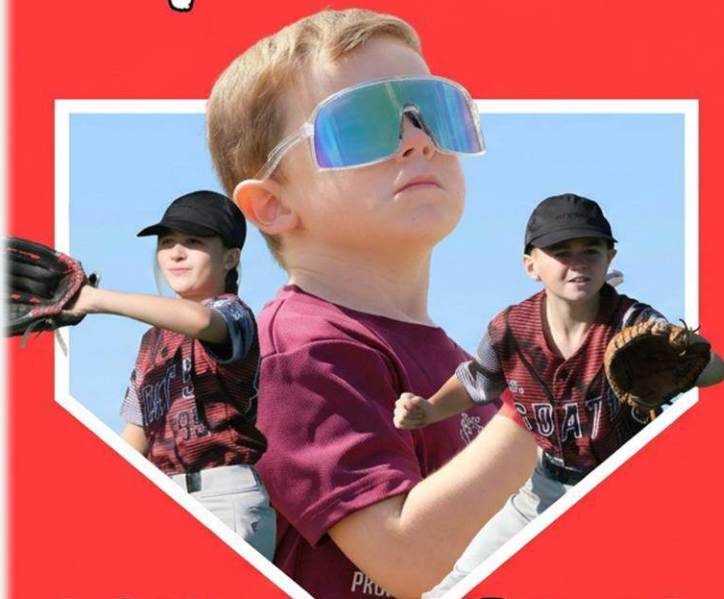

Hearing Screening Clinics for Reception Children



Did you know your child is entitled to a free hearing test whilst they are in reception class? Here are signs that may indicate hearing difficulties:

- Not responding when called
- Speaking very loudly
- Frequently asking for repetitions or responding inappropriately
- Increasing volume on devices
- Appearing to daydream
- Slow to learn or unclear speech
- Frequent frustration or aggression

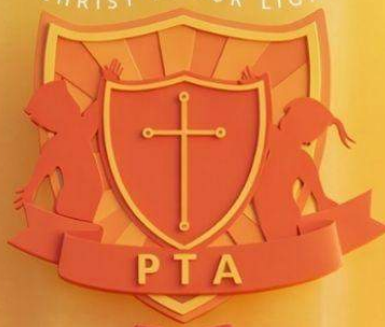

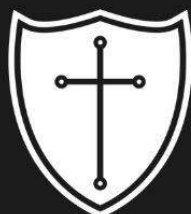

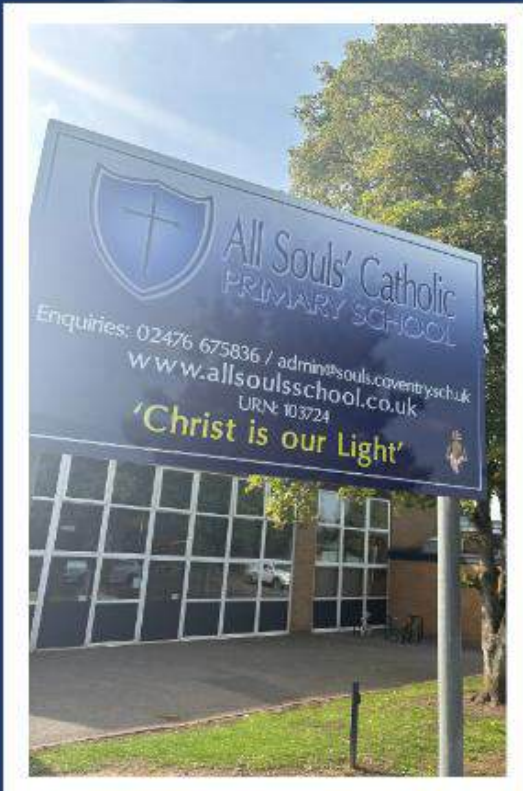
