AS vs A Level	We require all students to sit the AS exams at the end of Year 12. These results are useful to the department and students as well as UCAS. If the student continues their English study into Year 13, the AS grade will not form a standalone qualification. Instead the exams and coursework of Year 13 will give them one, final A Level grade. If students do not continue with their English Study, they will keep their AS grade as a standalone qualification.
