Post 16 - Nuffield Research Placements 2019

Applications for a Nuffield Research Placement are OPEN and students have started to apply already - applications will close on Friday 15th March 2019. There is just 64 days to go!

Nuffield Research Placements (previously Nuffield Science Bursaries) provide students with the opportunity to work alongside professional scientists, technologists, engineers and mathematicians on a real research project. Students in the first year of a post-16 science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) course are eligible to apply. Placements are available across the East Midlands, in universities, commercial companies, voluntary organisations and research institutions.

Undertaking a Nuffield Research Placement will inspire and motivate you. It will help give you the skills and confidence you need to get a place at a top university. The experience can be particularly valuable to students who don't have a family history of going to university, or who come from low income families. We want more students from these backgrounds to apply, and can offer you financial support while you undertake the placement.

To apply, students must:

- Be over 16 years old and in Year 12 (or equivalent).
- Be in full-time, state-funded education in the UK.
- Have at least 5 GCSEs (or equivalent) at Level 6 or above, including maths, a science subject and English (or another humanities subject).
- Be studying one or more A-level, Scottish Higher (or equivalent) in science, technology, engineering, economics, geography, geology, economics, psychology, computing, statistics or maths.
- Be able to spend four weeks of your summer holiday working on a research project.

We also require students to fulfill at least one of the following criteria to be eligible to apply:

- Are eligible for, or in receipt of, Free School Meals, or have been in the last six years
- Are receiving discretionary payments at school or college.
- Have a total household income below £30,000 (before tax).
- Are living in, or have lived in, local authority care.

Students will not be out of pocket at the end of their placement as we reimburse travel costs and students will also receive a bursary of £100 per week.
