These summer schools are prestigious schemes, providing not just an insight into higher education, but additional focus and motivation for students in their Year 13 studies. Plus, those students who attend our Summer School and subsequently enrol at the University of Nottingham as undergraduates will automatically receive the Nottingham Potential Bursary - £1000 per year for each year of undergraduate study!!

Please note, entry onto the summer schools is competitive and places will be allocated to those students meeting all or most of the listed criteria. We have doubled our capacity on our ever popular Medicine summer schools to help meet demand. Sutton Trust (open to students from across the UK) -Biological Sciences: Exploring the Living World – 8th-13th July Chemistry, Physics and Astronomy – 8th-13th July Historical Studies (History, Archaeology, Art History and Classics) – 8th-13th July Engineering, Maths and Computer Science - 22nd-27th July Literature, Language and Culture (English, Film, American Studies and Modern Languages/Cultures – no language experience required) – 22nd- 27th July Philosophy, Theology and Ethics – 22nd- 27th July

The deadline for applications is 28th February, and no late applications can be accepted.
