Parental Support Years 7 to 12



As we are now ending our 11th week of this new way of working, I thought I would share some of the ways we are supporting our students.

Alongside setting and marking imaginative work for our students, our teachers are providing feedback that ensures all pupils are making progress - even during remote learning - we really do believe that no student shall underachieve!

The LiFE MAT has also been supporting some of our families to receive vouchers to replace school meals, or delivering food hampers to their homes. I know that staff have really enjoyed getting around our catchment area and having socially distanced chats with our students and their families.

I am also aware that, during this time, some students may have used up a lot of your resources at home - paper, pens, books etc. With that in mind, we are preparing resource packs for a number of students from Year 7, 8 and 9 for whom the school is in receipt of Pupil Premium funding. If your child currently receives free school meals, or has at any time in the last 6 years, you will be able to collect a resource pack early next week - further details of this will be placed on the school website .

'Face to face' support for Year 10/12

Following recent Government announcements for schools to provide some face to face support for year 10 and 12 students we are making plans in readiness of the government confirming it is safe to go ahead. We have written a Risk Mitigation Plan and introduced many new safety measures across our school to ensure that the safety of our children, staff and families is paramount and we reduce the risk of transmission.

We have been planning extensively for an increasing number of students in attendance and are confident that

we can provide a safe and effective learning environment; our school will look very different to what students remember. On 21st May we ran in situ training with our staff so that they can confidently work with our students socially distanced and understand, as well as reinforce, our hygiene protocols. This week nearly 40 students have been in school as part of our 'Supervised Childcare' provision for key worker children.

It is our intention to widen our opening to year 10 and 12 students from Monday

15th June 2020 unless government guidance moves away from this date. To ensure social distancing is maintained we will be staggering starts and ends of the day, breaks and lunches, so it will not be a normal school day. Please find further details in this link to the <u>letter on our website</u>.

At the start of next week I will confirm more definite arrangements with parents of Year 10 and 12 students, along with a questionnaire and our Risk Mitigation Plan. Please be aware that these plans are conditional upon government announcements next week. This programme of support still provides only limited provision in school as we follow government advice, our home learning programme still remains an essential part of continued learning as it is for students in years 7 to 9.

Thank you for your support and your patience in waiting for further details.

Staying Safe Online

The impact of C-19 means that most of us will be at home for an extended period and are likely to be spending increasing amounts of time online.

The online world is a necessity for our children in accessing school work and it delivers huge benefits, not least in enabling us to stay connected to family and friends during this period. However, many parents may feel concerned about the content their children are accessing. Although rare, there is a risk that increased online activity and feelings of stress and isolation may be exploited by negative influences and online groomers of all kinds to target vulnerable children and young people directly.

An understanding of digital safety will help parents and carers safeguard loved ones from a range of harms. Here are some resources available to help you understand and protect your child from different harms online.

- <u>Educate Against Hate</u> Parents' Hub provides resources and government advice for parents and carers on keeping young people safe from extremism.
- <u>Let's Talk About It</u> provides support for parents and carers to keep children safe from online radicalisation.
- <u>UK Safer Internet Centre</u> has guides on the privacy settings, parental controls and internet safety features of the major internet service providers.
- <u>Parent Zone</u> works with Prevent to provide digital safety advice for parents.
- <u>Thinkuknow</u> provides resources for parents and carers to help keep children safe online.
- <u>Parent Info</u> provides digital support and guidance for parents and carers from leading experts and organisations
- Childline can provide advice and support if your child is worried, from dialling 0800 1111 or downloading the 'For Me' app.

Autumn Series GCSE, AS/A level

Ofqual are consulting on proposed arrangements for an additional GCSE, AS and A level exam series to take place in Autumn 2020. This was announced by the government when it cancelled the summer 2020 exam series for Year 11, 12 and 13 students.


We currently use the payment portal for adding funds to be spent in the school's canteen, this will now be extended further to include payments for trips, resources, buses, materials and so on.

Bosworth Academy written about in a book!

For the past 6 years we have worked closely with the internationally - renowned educationalist Professor Hargreaves at Boston University, USA, to develop our provision for students in line with his book 'The Fourth Way' (2009). We are very pleased to say that our work has now been recognised in his latest book 'Moving'. In this book the prestigious professor, government adviser, and global change agent Andy Hargreaves discusses social mobility - the chance, through education, to achieve greater success compared to one's parents - is one of the most



compelling issues of our time. He shares candid, poignant and occasionally hilarious personal experiences of social mobility. Deeply revealing, emotionally direct, and intellectually insightful, the book begins in 1950s Northwest England and takes readers up to Hargreaves's university education in the late 1960s and early 1970s. An image from the book featuring Bosworth Academy is captured here. Abridged quote from the book 'Others extend this

community connection to the curriculum. For instance, Bosworth Academy ... has taken learning beyond the school gate and into the local community. It has fostered interdisciplinary enquiry into local historical issues such as the impact of the Norman Conquest on the surrounding area...The school has also supported local charities and helped to save the village public library from closure.'

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Seneca Learn: Parental Instructions

You may have seen that your child has been set work by their teachers on something called Seneca Learn. But what is this? Seneca Learn is an online



learning platform that covers all subjects on the national curriculum. It uses smart learning algorithms that are proven to make students remember topics better. If a student gets a question wrong, they'll be shown the content again but in a different format. The content is shown again at a time when it is optimal for students to learn it. Seneca Learn also hand selects the best GIFs and memes on the internet so revision makes students laugh instead of stressed.

The great news for parents is that they have just released a free parent monitoring platform. This lets you see how long your child has spent on different subjects, their average score and number of questions they've answered. To sign up click the following link: Seneca Learn instructions.
