Welcome

16th October 2020 I would like to thank all students, staff and Weekly Newsletter for Parents & Students parents/carers for all of your amazing support through what has been such a challenging term. Everyone has truly worked together as a community to ensure we stay safe during these difficult times. Attendance has remained high, at over 95%, above normal national averages, which is supporting students in getting back into good learning routines. Students at home isolating have also engaged well with remote learning. A recently published report analysed the data on the health and wellbeing of children and young people's experiences during the coronavirus outbreak. This report suggests that returning to schools is likely to be playing a vital role in improving the mental wellbeing of many pupils by easing some of the main worries identified in the research: time off from education, being isolated from friends, fewer opportunities to be more physically active and access to pastoral support.

Last Friday we promoted #HelloYellow Young Minds Awareness Day. Students and staff wore items of yellow

clothing to promote and support young people's mental health, raising money for this charity. Mentally Healthy Schools have created a toolkit of resources that focus on inclusivity and celebrating our differences. The resources in this toolkit are designed to help schools support pupils who may need more help with their mental health and celebrate the unique and different qualities that each child brings to our school community. You may find these resources useful and want to discuss them with your child.



In assemblies this week we have focused on the importance of our Six Global Competencies, the 6Cs. These describe the skills and attributes needed for learners to flourish as citizens of the world. In our definition, Deep Learning is the process of acquiring these six Competencies: Character, Citizenship, Collaboration, Communication, Creativity and Critical Thinking. When learners are immersed in the 6Cs, they learn more than content, and this learning contributes to their own futures and often to the betterment of their communities and beyond. Students are working towards our 6C colours to achieve recognition and are rewarded with 6C lapel badges at different levels. See the section later by Mr. Moore for more information.

With the new three tier system of Covid-19 restrictions now in place in England it is vital that we all continue to follow good hygiene procedures as well as our risk mitigation plans in school. Over half-term it will be important



to remind children to continue to stay safe whilst out with friends, adhering to the 'rule of six' maintaining 2m social distance whenever they can and using other precautions like wearing a face mask. Please remind them of the quote by C.S. Lewis, "Integrity is doing the right thing, even when no-one is watching". Here is a nice video that serves as a good reminder of Hands Face Space.

Finally, I hope you all have a well-deserved half-term break. Enjoy time as a family and we'll hope to see everyone back on Monday 26th October.

Reward Points and Houses

Our students have had a very successful half term, collecting lots of reward points. In total students have been given over 13,000 reward points in this half term. A number of students are already reaching our Bronze level and are on their way to achieving the Silver level.

Leading the way in terms of rewards are our Year Seven, followed closely by Year Eight. Competition in Key Stage Four is much tighter with all three years very close together in points totals. In Key Stage Five our new Year Twelve students have settled really well and have a strong lead over Year Thirteen.

The reward points students are given all contribute to the total for their house. At present in our house competition Obama is leading the way with 3853 reward points, followed closely by Malala on 3634. Winter House has 3500 reward points and Curie 2689.

In the next half term we will begin our house competitions where students can compete for their house to gain reward points and prizes.

You may have heard on Monday that the government has made some changes to the exam dates for this summer. This is to give students more time to prepare and help them make up for the disruption caused by the pandemic.

Most exams will now be three weeks later than usual. The summer exam series will now start on 7th June and end on 2nd July for almost all AS, A Level and GCSE subjects.

One GCSE English paper and one Maths paper will be scheduled before the summer half term in May.

Year 7 and 8 Parents Support Your Child's Reading



Our Year 7 and 8 students are now set up with the amazing Accelerated Reader programme. You should have received your letter (via your child's bag!) detailing how the programme works, and how you can support your child in using it.

How does the programme work?

Your child has taken a 'Star Reader' test to determine their current reading level, and to find out which books are suitable for them. Recommended Accelerated Reader books will push students beyond their reading age, and help them make the progress which will be vital for accessing GCSE exam papers later on. Once they have finished a book, students log onto the AR database of over 31,000 book quizzes and complete the relevant one. These regular quizzes determine a student's reading progress and provide instant feedback.

How can you support your child's reading?

Research shows that students need to read at least 20 mins a day to make significant progress. Ideally, your child should aim to read at least a book a fortnight. To help them establish this routine, your child has been issued with a reading record booklet, checked fortnightly by English teachers, where we would ask you to sign to show that they are reading the required amount. It would be absolutely fantastic if you can help your child to find a regular time for reading each day, if you can talk to your child about their current book, and best of all, listen to them read!

Access to thousands of free books!

In addition to our wonderful library (The Compass), Bosworth Academy provides an online library system found under 'The Compass' heading on the Bosworth cloud homepage. As well as reserving actual books here, students can download E books. Click on 'Accessit', to find inspiring book information, and then click on 'Visual Search' to find a link to all the Accelerated Reader books in our library. Lastly, for even more choice, please encourage your son/daughter to join your local library which is Leicestershire Public Libraries, Leicester City Public Libraries, or both.

Covid-19 and Staying Safe

Parents and carers must carefully follow procedures around COVID-19.

If your child develops coronavirus symptoms in school we will contact parents so you can immediately pick them up. You must get your child tested as soon as possible and inform us of a positive result.

This allows us to begin our own track and trace system in school to identify close contacts.

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms. For most people, COVID-19 will be a mild illness.

If you have <u>symptoms</u> of COVID-19 however mild, you must selfisolate for at least 10 days from when your symptoms started. Go to <u>testing</u> website link to arrange a test. **You must not send children in your household to school** - please call the school to inform us. Members of the household are required to self-isolate for 14 days unless a negative test result is received and then you can end isolation. Please follow this advice - it is vital to ensure that we keep our communities safe and avoid school having to send home many students to self-isolate for 14 days if they have been in close contact with someone who has a positive test result.

If your son/daughter has Covid symptoms these rules must be followed:

- They must NOT come into school
- You must contact the school and inform us of their illness.
- You must organise a test immediately
- You must inform the school of the result of the test

If a member of your household has Covid symptoms these rules must be followed:

- Everyone who lives in the house must self isolate immediately so your son/daughter must not come into school
- The person should book a test immediately
- If the test is negative your son/daughter may come back to school
- If the test is **positive** all members of the household must spend 14 days in self isolation.

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
