Welcome

4th December 2020 This week we saw an end to the second Weekly Newsletter for Parents & Students set of national restrictions, though our region remains in the highest tier 3 to ensure we reduce transmission of coronavirus. It is vital as a school and wider community we continue to follow the guidance, ultimately we wish to keep our children safe in school and avoid having to isolate close contacts. I welcome the great news that our world leading scientists have created a vaccine, though we must not get complacent in our mitigating risk measures. It will take many months before we can return to normal. Please reinforce with your child the importance of continuing to wear a face mask, wash hands frequently and to socially distance particularly.

As we approach Christmas, engaging learning continues, and will do as ever at Bosworth Academy, right up to and including the final day of term, Friday 18th December. During these next two weeks I urge you to monitor your child's health and your own. If you believe they have symptoms of coronavirus or other illness then please be cautious and book a test. Our experience over the last two weeks is that testing sites in Leicestershire are issuing results within 24 hours which is helpful to all of us. If we can avoid cases in school that will benefit our whole community in the run up to Christmas.

This week we began our Trial (Mock) Exams for students in exam years 11, 12 and 13. We have been impressed by students' approach and attitudes to these examinations, revising well in advance and following our new safe guidelines brilliantly. Student conduct has remained exceptional so I commend all involved. Expect a 'mock' results day to be held in January and results shared with parents. This week we 'finally' welcomed news of a decision about summer exams for 2020/21 from the Secretary of State for Education. Though we won't receive the detail until January, we welcome further news about the structure of exams and

how more flexibility may reflect the needs of different cohorts who will have missed different amounts of teaching. There will be no perfect solution I am certain. I will update parents further in January on the examination situation.

Today our children and families showed true compassion towards Leicestershire's most vulnerable and disadvantaged people. Boxes and boxes of food and toiletries were shared with the charity 'Open Hands' ready for them to distribute over the Christmas period. A huge well done to all involved and To Mrs. Boyce for organising our efforts.





Attendance in school continues to be high, with 96% of children in school, which is higher than the normal national average. This genuinely reflects the huge efforts made by our staff, our students and you as parents and carers in supporting one another during this challenging period. There continues to be a real focus on providing engaging lessons for our students and we have planned a series of covid-safe Christmas activities. I would welcome any parents who would like to thank any staff members for their support during this time by emailing their message to us like we did in the summer term.

This incredible achievement has truly shone a light on working towards a world where all boys and men take action to be mentally well, and are supported by those around them.

To ensure we sprinkle some festive cheer around the school in these challenging times, there will be a number of activities throughout the last couple of weeks. These include:


- Harry Potter Experience (Year 7 and 8)

Covid-19 and Staying Safe

Parents and carers must carefully follow procedures around COVID-19.

This allows us to begin our own track and trace system in school to identify close contacts.

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

For most people, COVID-19 will be a mild illness. If you have <u>symptoms</u> of COVID-19 however mild, you must self-isolate for at least 10 days from when your symptoms started. Go to <u>testing</u> website link to arrange a test. **You must not send children in your household to school** - please call the school to inform us. Members of the household are required to self-isolate for 14 days unless a negative test result is received and then you can end isolation. Contact <u>attendance@bosworthacademy.org.uk</u> with any queries.

Please follow this advice - it is vital to ensure that we keep our communities safe and avoid school having to send home many students to self-isolate for 14 days if they have been in close contact with someone who has a positive test result.
