Weekly Newsletter for Parents & Students It has been a delight to see 660 students arriving at school this week from years 13, 11 and 12, even though this has just been for their first Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test. Though a few students were a little anxious, they were in and out in less than 10 minutes, from drop-off to pick-up, and left feeling happy to have been tested and played their part in keeping others protected. Participation in testing has been exceptionally high with 98% of the parents of children in these year groups consenting. The LFD test is an additional risk mitigation step this spring term to protect our community further by preventing transmission of coronavirus from asymptomatic young people. Hopefully, this high engagement will ensure far fewer students will be sent home to isolate themselves if they are identified as a close contact of a student who comes into school with the virus. At school, I am always devastated to have to tell one of our students and text their parents to tell them that their child has to isolate for 10 days - particularly now after they have missed so much time being in school. For students in year 7 to 10, if you haven't yet completed the consent form then please follow this link. I'd like to thank parents for the efforts that you have gone to bringing your

child to school for this first test.

Next week will see the return of students on various days of the week. Please follow the timetable shared last week, and shown below. Students need to remember that school life will be similar to how it was in the Autumn term, with the addition of testing, and face coverings in lessons, rather than back to 'normal'. On arrival they must walk straight to their tutor group where their tutor will warmly greet them, find out how they are feeling and go through some reminders of our safety expectations. They will return to following their usual timetable of subjects and lesson timings. Please check they are organised with a charged iPad, equipment and any books they need. Parents should support their child in getting them back into those 'going to school' routines after not being in since 17th December 2020. There are lots of important

messages and reminders in this newsletter to support this transition, please contact your child's tutor or Head of Year if you need any further information.

With the exceptional work and engagement completed during this remote learning period, we are confident that our children can re-engage successfully in face-to-face lessons. We will not be assessing or testing students in these first few weeks or making them panic with talk of 'catch-up'. It is important that students don't feel that level of pressure and can once more 'love' learning with their peers. Teachers will determine where students need further support and put in place what is required in a focused way. We'll be telling them that we can achieve amazing things together.



Thursday saw amazing engagement in our first-ever remote World Book Day, which included staff and students dressing as their favourite literary characters and taking a picture of themselves reading in unusual places. The day was brilliant - far more information is shared later in this newsletter. On World Book Day I read a quote by the author Wendy Wunder which resonated, she said, **"The magic thing about home is that it feels good to leave, and it feels even better to come back."** I know school is not quite 'home' though I hope, like me, all of our young people are truly looking forward to their return to school next week.

Dear students,

I know that all of the staff at Bosworth Academy are looking forward to welcoming you back to school. I hope that you are all as eager as we are to return to lessons and for you to be able to meet your friends. Before you return, we wanted to remind you of some key considerations back in school: From Monday 8th March;

be ready to follow your timetable for WEEK 1

- enter school only through the doors at the bus park, sanitise hands and go straight to your tutor room
- tutor time begins at 8.40am and please let your tutor/assistant Head of Year know if you do not have your ID card or lanyard
- be in **full uniform**, with a **charged ipad** and all **equipment**
- your usual way of accessing lunch, a snack for break and at least one **large water bottle**, top ups from the canteen (water fountain taps must remain off).
- please bring at least 1 <u>face covering</u> (a spare is a good idea if you have one).

I thought I would share the news with you that from 1 March 2021 if you have a child in your household attending school then you too can get a twice-weekly test. Around 1 in 3 people with coronavirus (COVID-19) do not have symptoms but can still pass it on to others. Regular testing of people without symptoms (asymptomatic testing) is important to help stop the virus spreading. As lockdown restrictions gradually ease, we all need to play our part to help protect each other. Test kits can be obtained:

- through your employer if they offer testing to employees
- at a local test site
- by collecting a home test kit from a test site
- by ordering a home test kit online

Schools will not be expected to provide the test kits to families or administer the family testing process. This additional testing in households will help prevent transmission of coronavirus into school.

Transport Update

To support the return to school buses will be running a normal service from Monday 8th March. This means on the morning each year group is able to return to school, the buses will be running their usual routes and timings. Can I please remind students the following applies when using dedicated school transport.

- use of hand sanitiser upon boarding and/or disembarking where provided
- organised queuing and boarding where possible
- distancing within vehicles wherever possible
- the use of face coverings for children over the age of 11
- students will be asked to sit in the same seat for each journey

Following my update earlier in the Spring term, I can confirm that a 50% refund for the 8 week closure period will be processed by the finance team. This is as outlined in the transport agreement shared at the beginning of the year. At the same time, any outstanding payments will also be followed by the finance team. 
Parent Consultation Evening for students in Year 9 and 10


Books, Reading, eBook Library



Hair-Raising Horror at Crater Lake Frighteningly Fearful, Fun & A Firm Favourite

It could have been aliens, monsters or even zombies! Crater Lake's Activity Centre is shrouded in deep, dark secrets unbeknown to Lance and his friends who excitedly arrive for their school residential trip! Surprisingly, the indoor activity centre is blowing out extreme blazing heat during the height of summer. Weird...right? Lance and co. are amongst frightening sinister beings who lurk around each and every corner. They must never EVER fall asleep.

I read this chilling tale thinking it wouldn't be that scary, BUT I WAS WRONG! I devoured this book in a few days as it was so heart thumpingly gripping, and left me on the edge of my seat.
