12th March 2021 It has been such a joyful week welcoming students back to school. There was a real sense of excitement and some nervousness as students returned to the routine of being back in school to learn. Breaks and lunchtimes have been filled with laughter and chatter as friends have been able to reunite and catch-up. Teachers have flourished this week and shared with me so many lovely comments about how happy they have felt to teach in person once more. I'd like to thank all parents and carers for your patience this week, especially parents of year 8 and 9 whose children returned later than others.

BOSWORTH ACADEMY TOGETHER WE ACHIEVE

Weekly Newsletter for Parents & Students Our challenge this week and next has not only been planning the first test but the subsequent ones. Unless we staggered our return we would have needed to test an impossible number of students in one day, 3-5 days after the first test. Our take-up of tests has been incredibly high, far above that reported nationally, with now over 98% of students being tested. In these first couple of weeks, this means conducting over five thousand Lateral Flow Device tests - which we would never have thought a year ago would have been possible in a school! You will read in a separate letter and later in this newsletter how we will make the transition after 3 tests in school to home testing and how results should be shared with the school and the NHS. Staff have begun this already and I can assure you that it is very straightforward once you've done it once.

I'd like to thank you all for the part that you have played in keeping our school and community safe. We must all remain vigilant about social distancing and following hygiene measures. Covid-19 cases are falling across Leicestershire and Leicester but are still higher than nationally. Some Leicestershire schools have already sent home many students and some teachers to self-isolate as close contacts. Please continue to discuss with your child the importance of wearing face coverings, replacing or washing them frequently and washing hands frequently. We have been impressed with how well students have adapted to wearing face coverings in lessons. This is not pleasant or something that any of us wish to do, though our students have done this without fuss or even many reminders.

For parents of students in examination years 11, 12 and 13 we will be sharing more and more information explaining how the process of grading will work this summer. Exam boards are due to publish resources and detailed guidance for schools at the end of March. The best thing for students to do now is to continue to focus during every lesson, challenge themselves with their learning, act on feedback from teachers, practise past exam questions and revise.

Our children mustn't feel low listening to negative media commentary about lost learning. I shared this poem with staff in our weekly remote briefing from a student's view;

"Don't tell me I'm behind." "Don't tell me I need to catch-up."

"Don't tell me I'll be held back forever."

"Don't tell me I need longer at school." "Don't tell me l'm lost."

As teachers and support staff we will;

"Tell them they can do it."

"Tell them they have learned so much."

"Tell them we'll be there to help & support."

"Tell them we believe in them."

"Tell them we'll achieve amazing things together."

We are aware that during lockdown many of our students achieved incredible things and adapted brilliantly, for others it was a difficult struggle with so many different challenges to face. We'll be there to support our children and look to a positive future with many

opportunities. As the writer C.S. Lewis said, "Getting over a painful experience is much like crossing monkey bars. You have to let go at some point in order to move forward."

We should all celebrate what we've shown we are capable of this year and use this return to school as an opportunity for positive change.

LFD Testing

We have been overwhelmed by the support of students who have attended appointments for their initial Covid- 19 tests in school and would like to thank parents/ carers for ensuring that their children were able to attend.

Once students have had the opportunity to attend 3 tests with their year group we will be distributing home test kits for students to continue the testing process. The tests should be carried out twice a week, ideally on a Sunday evening and midweek on a Wednesday. Guidance on how to complete the test is included in this link - <u>How to</u> <u>do a Covid-19 Self Test</u>

Home test kits are free of charge and will be provided by the school when the third test for that year group has been conducted, to be given out during registration on Monday 15th March for students in Year 11, 12 and 13 and on either Tuesday 16th March or Wednesday 17th March for those in Years 7-10. Students will receive 2 boxes and a new set of instructions which should not be opened until students return home. Please disregard the instructions contained within the box. Each box contains 3 tests. Students/Parents should understand the testing process and have read our privacy notice. Then by conducting a home test they are consenting to self-administer the test and provide results to the NHS and Bosworth Academy. All participation in home testing is voluntary though we would strongly recommend that you continue the testing process with your child.

Once students have completed their home tests they will be able to log the test result online at <u>https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result</u> and need to also, separately, inform Bosworth Academy of the test result via <u>http://bit.ly/BosworthLFT</u>. You will receive a text/email notification of a positive or negative result from NHS Test & Trace.

Members of households, with school age pupils

I thought I would share the news with you that from 1 March 2021 if you have a child in your household attending school then you too can get a twiceweekly test. Around 1 in 3 people with coronavirus (COVID-19) do not have symptoms but can still pass it on to others. Regular testing of people without symptoms (asymptomatic testing) is important to help stop the virus spreading. As lockdown restrictions gradually ease, we all need to play our part to help protect each other. Test kits can be obtained:


- through your employer if they offer testing to employees
- at a local test site
- by collecting a home test kit from a test site
- by ordering a home test kit online

Schools will not be expected to provide the test kits to families or administer the family testing process. This additional testing in households will help prevent transmission of coronavirus into school.




AR level 5.1

AR level 5.4



AR level 4.1


John and Rose link a missing teacher and a dead student with a vampire mourning his lost love.




AR level 4.3

Welcome to The Island. Where your worst fears are about to come true...


It was supposed to be the perfect holiday: a week-long trip for six teenage friends on a remote tropical island.
