This week it was great to see our new Year 12 students join our successful Sixth Form, The Oaks. Once more we have students joining us from a range of schools across the county as well as from Bosworth Academy. Well over 230 students joined us for their induction day on Wednesday, where they learned so much more about their new school, including finding their way around. Due to the pandemic, this is the

Weekly Newsletter for parents & Students first cohort of sixth form students we've had who have not had the opportunity to join us for an Open Day or on-site interviews, and have only till now had a virtual experience. We wish them all great

success over the next two years and look forward to celebrating many successes in this newsletter.

Students across all years have settled into being back to school exceptionally well. Over the last few days over 1500 reward points have been allocated to students. In the coming weeks, I'm sure we'll be seeing students achieving their first Bronze lapel badges. Students will also be striving to be recognised as they develop their skills in the six global competencies, we call the 6Cs. Students are awarded 'Colours' by achieving attributes for deep learning in; Character, Collaboration, Creativity, Citizenship, Communication and Critical Thinking. Our learners from years 7 to 13 can be recognised and awarded a 'Colours' badge and certificate of recognition for excelling

in each area.

As the majority of schools across the country reopen there is increased media coverage of keeping schools safe. Bosworth Academy students have been very diligent in following our updated risk mitigation plan this academic year. They are encouraged to sanitise or wash their hands regularly, have cleaning wipes for tables in lessons and are following our one way systems to avoid crowding. All students have now transitioned to twice weekly LFD testing at home and I encourage all students and staff to do this twice a week and report results to us. This prevents positive, sometimes asymptomatic children, from coming into school and transmitting the virus to others. If your child has coronavirus symptoms or tests positive then please inform us using our specific email address attendance@bosworthacademy.org.uk, keep them at home and book a PCR test. We will continue to support students who need to self-isolate with remote learning.

Throughout the school day, we have been reminding our students of our values - the things that we believe are so important both in school and in life. This has included talking to students in lessons and tutor time about taking responsibility for their actions and for the world around them. This includes showing responsible behaviours in their lessons, in corridors or by disposing of litter in the bins around school. We believe strongly in

showing integrity, knowing and doing what is right at all times. I have been so proud of the vast number of students who have been displaying many random acts of kindness; holding doors open for staff, clearing their lunch table, helping a new student to find a

classroom or even smiling and saying good morning when they first come into school. As Aesop said in his famous fable of the Lion and the Mouse, "No act of kindness, no matter how small, is ever wasted." Let's all encourage our young people to be kind whenever possible, it's always possible.

All students should have been given a box of tests for home use and should upload their results in two places;



PE Kit

A reminder to parents of our expectations for kit students must wear for all their PE lessons.

KS3 (Year 7 and 8)

- Black Bosworth Academy polo shirt
- Black Bosworth Academy joggers/ leggings OR purple shorts
- Purple socks
- Black Bosworth Academy hoodie for cold weather
- Suitable footwear for the facility

KS4 (Year 9-11)

- Black Bosworth Academy polo shirt
- Black Bosworth Academy hoodie for cold weather
- Black joggers/ leggings/ shorts
- Suitable footwear for the facility

For all years

- No alternative polo or hoodies should be worn.
- Any suitable waterproof is fine for wet weather lessons.
- For swimming students require a swimming costume/ shorts/ trunks and, should they wish, can wear leggings, shorts, t-shirts into the water.
- For the new 3G pitch all students are required to wear studded football boots to help prolong the life of the newly laid surface.

All Bosworth Academy PE kit can be purchased from our kit supplier, <u>Liss Sport</u>. If your child is receives free

school meals or pupil premium funding then the school can support the purchase of these items should support be required. Please contact your child's PE teacher for this.





It was lovely to see our students back in school and looking really smart. We believe that our uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the positive ethos of our academy, setting an appropriate tone. Our students are expected to wear the following school uniform and we would really appreciate your support on this matter.:



- Trousers must be mid grey in colour (definitely not charcoal grey or black) and formal style.
- Skirts must be of appropriate length mid grey in colour (definitely not charcoal grey or black) and pleated, formal style. No skater skirts.
- Shirts must be formal shirts with a collar and top button must be done up at all times.
- Ties must be worn at all times.
- Shoes/ Trainers must be completely black, with no colours or logos. Laces must be plain black.
- Socks / tights must be plain black, grey or white. Knee socks are permitted with skirts but should definitely not come higher than just below the knee.
- Jewellery and heavy makeup is not allowed, a watch and a single pair of stud earrings are acceptable. Inappropriate jewellery will be confiscated until the end of the day.
- Jumper- Purple, school logo (Year 7-8).
- Jumper Grey, school logo (Year 9-11) Not to be worn instead of a blazer
- Blazer to be worn at all times (year 9-11)

Hoodies and tracksuit tops are not permitted in the school building and will be confiscated until the end of the school day.
