This week has felt like the summer term once more, with students enjoying their break and lunch in the glorious sunshine. It's also been proving good for butterflies too with



some rarer species appearing now instead of in July! It has of course been quite a hot environment to learn in and I know many students will welcome the cooler September temperatures that we are returning to. I must share though how well students have coped as they have continued to focus and learn well in lessons.

Weekly Newsletter for Parents & Students Yesterday I wrote to all parents about the increase in COVID cases across Leicestershire and in our school. The letter can be found on our website and was communicated to parents using the WEDUC app. Due to the rise in new positive cases, we are introducing additional measures as we aim to keep our

students, staff and wider community safe. We are now asking students to return to wearing face masks in communal areas. It is especially important that they are worn when students are moving between lessons on busy corridors. Face masks should also be worn when students are using school transport. From Monday we will be ensuring that students follow this risk mitigation. Tutors will be able to issue a face mask if they forget to bring one. The Local Health Protection Team are clear that we are not at the stage of requiring face masks in lessons, though students who choose to wear them in classes may do as some students have chosen to since the start of term. Please note if your child was exempt from wearing one last term you do not need to contact the school as we are aware. We will monitor the situation and will write to you again if we are advised to take any further steps or remove measures.

We are reminding all students to continue twice-weekly testing and will be strongly encouraging any students who may have stopped home testing to begin once more. It is clear that the LFT tests are picking up asymptomatic cases. I'd like to thank all parents for your support in reporting these results to school and keeping your child at home if the test is positive whilst you await the result of a follow-up PCR test. Students may pick up additional test kits from reception if these are required. If your child has coronavirus symptoms or tests positive please contact our attendance team at attendance@bosworthacademy.org.uk.

On 23rd September we have our Open Day for new year 7 and year 12 students for Academic Year 2022/23. Our theme this year is 'The future we want'. We challenge our students to be 'better than they thought they could be', confident that they can be future leaders, ready to adapt to an ever-changing world and transition into job sectors that don't even exist yet! The evening, running from 5-8 pm will be mainly for year 5 and 6 children considering joining our school, we have a dedicated Sixth Form Evening on 28th October. This year we are reducing numbers in each presentation by running three presentations across the evening. Places are being taken up fast and can



be booked by following this link Bosworth Open Evening. We are requiring a number of students across different year groups to be Bosworth Ambassadors for the evening to showcase the learning across all subject areas and to be tour guides. Please ask your son or daughter to let their Head of Year know if they would like to be an Ambassador that evening. Even a few weeks in our new year 7 students will have the confidence to show primary aged children around our big building!

As we all continue to rise to the various challenges ahead of us which continue this term, it is worth remembering the great resilience our children are learning. As Maya Angelou said, "We delight in the beauty of the butterfly, but rarely admit the changes it has gone through to achieve that beauty."

Thank you all for your continued support as we continue our great journey to a brighter future together.


We are really excited to welcome parents and prospective students to our Open Evening event on 23 September 2021. The event is aimed at those in primary school who are looking to attend our school next academic year.

I am writing to inform you of how the additional bank holiday this academic year will affect our term dates. You may be aware, an extra bank holiday has been recently announced for 3rd June 2022 for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. As on previous similar occasions (e.g. the 2012 Diamond Jubilee or 2011 Royal Wedding), the DfE has amended the Education Regulations to reduce the school year 2021/22 for schools to 189 days. Schools are, however, already on half term at the time of the bank holiday, and therefore we are required to place the additional day elsewhere in this academic year.

There will never be an ideal time for all schools and all families to adapt to changes in school dates. We feel it is important to situate the day at a point when we will gain the maximum benefit to well-being for staff and students during what has been a highly challenging time for us all. Leicestershire has the longest Autumn term (16 weeks) of any authority nationwide. This leads to fatique and sometimes more illness in late November and December for both staff and students. We also expect that Covid cases could well be very high at this time. The local authority is yet to decide when they recommend the day is taken. However, the majority of Leicestershire schools are academies and will make their own separate decisions; we are sharing our agreed day now as we believe it is important to give you the maximum notice of this change. Consequently, Bosworth Academy and all schools within the LiFE Multi-Academy Trust have determined that our schools will be closed for the additional day on Friday 3rd December 2021.

"L'shanah tovah" to all of our Jewish community...

Rosh Hashanah is a two day festival, celebrating the Jewish new year. This year, this festival was celebrated on the 6-8th September.

What does it symbolise?

Rosh Hashanah is a celebration of the creation of the world and marks making a fresh start.

It is a time for people to reflect on the past year and to ask for forgiveness for anything wrong they feel they have done.

They can also think about their priorities in life and what it important to them.

The festival also marks a time of judgment, when Jewish people believe that God balances a person's good acts over the last year with their bad acts, and decides what the coming 12 months will be like for them.

And, next week, Yom Kippur will be celebrated on the **15th and 16th September.**

Yom Kippur means **Day of Atonement**. It is the most sacred and solemn day in the Jewish calendar.

When is Yom Kippur?

Yom Kippur is celebrated in September or October in the UK. In 2021 Yom Kippur will begin in the evening of **Wednesday 15 September**.

Yom Kippur is ten days after **Rosh Hashanah**, the Jewish New Year, which celebrates the anniversary of the creation of the world.

More information will be rolled out from January 21 so we encourage you to download the Weduc app and start using it as soon as possible to stay in touch.






Bosworth Academy in the Community
