I'd like to thank all parents for allowing your children to support us on the evening. So many visitors found me to share how brilliantly helpful our ambassadors were. They were especially impressed with the confidence, enthusiasm and

articulation of our strong values. You should feel really proud.

Wednesday saw us complete a Fire Drill, the first of the year. Evacuating nearly 1700 students from our school as well as 200 staff is quite an event on our calendar. I need to share with you how impressed we were with student conduct. In an important safety drill like this, we expect all students to line up in silence whilst we



conduct safety checks and account for every person on site. To observe all 1700 students in absolute silence gives a true sense of our community working together. Please thank your child for the part they played in enabling us to conduct a safe fire drill.

The incredible character and communication skills showed by our students this week at Open Evening and around school has been stunning. As Maya Angelou said, "If you're always trying to be normal you'll never know how amazing you can be." This week our students and their attitudes were certainly not 'normal' but simply amazing!

Face Masks

Following a meeting with the Local Health Team this week we have agreed to reintroduce face masks in lessons from Monday 27th September. The number of positive cases is similar to last week, but as we see cases rising quite dramatically across our community we need to mitigate risk further to ensure students can stay in school. Wearing masks will also help reduce possible transmission to our staff. Recently some schools have needed to switch to remote learning for some year groups because of high numbers of teaching staff ill with Covid. I really want to avoid this being the case here, even though none of us likes to wear a face mask for long periods.

We will review the situation in 2 weeks. This measure is only effective if the vast majority of students wear a face mask. I would appreciate it if you talk this measure through with your child before Monday and thank you for your support. If your child has been exempt from wearing a face mask in corridors then this will continue in lessons.





The form is available on the Government website. Please note that the Council is unable to make use of rooms or areas in a shared property.

Supporting our iPad Scheme

As a school, we have always seen the value that technology brings to the classroom which is why we issue all new year 7 students with an iPad. We believe that technology enhances learning at all levels and provides students with opportunities to work collaboratively and dynamically across all of their lessons. Indeed, during the first lockdown, our school was well-positioned to run remote learning from day one and over the last two academic years, our students have been able to experience uninterrupted education through live lessons and high-quality resource sharing using the technology at our disposal.

Students are able to take their iPads home to support their home learning too. All internet traffic is filtered through our systems to prevent students from accessing anything they shouldn't, even when at home.

As you can imagine, providing an iPad to each student isn't cheap, nor is the software that we use in lessons or to provide the additional security measures to keep children safe. That is why we ask parents and carers, if they can, to support the scheme with voluntary contributions. These contributions effectively pay for the iPad and associated software that your child uses. At the end of the five years, those who have supported the scheme are gifted the iPad. Many students purchase their iPad at the end of the five years but supporting the scheme over a five-year period rather than at the end really helps support the school in providing the best learning opportunities that we can. You can start and stop the voluntary contributions whenever you like, so even if your child is in year 11, you can start supporting the scheme today! Home Testing for Covid-19

Testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection of Covid-19 within schools. That is why, whilst some measures have been relaxed, others will remain, including twice-weekly testing for staff and students. Students should undertake twice-weekly home tests on a Wednesday evening or Thursday morning and Sunday evening or Monday morning until the end of September, when this will also be reviewed. Students with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection. They will also need to get a free PCR test to check if they have COVID-19.

Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate. If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the pupil can return to school, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms.

Students should not come into school if they have symptoms.

Please remember that if students have had coronavirus within the last 90 days they will not be required to test, but should return to regular testing following that period of time.
